

03-08-2025 - WINDY DAY. We had low count today but we were able to fully operate our Museum. We got a lot of paper work done and planning for future operations. We had estimate of only 39 attending but I took one tour on LYT and the cold wind really reminded me of conditions that track workers had to endure, That means we are presenting living history.

03-15-2025 - BUSY DAY PLANNING RETURN TO MP 57. We had a good day but busy with plans for returning to MP 57. We went to UPS and picked up our derailer, checked it out and test fit it on maintenance track and had CSX stop by and give us proper instructions on using it. Officers and several members stayed late discussing what logs, what training we needed to comply with before we can return properly (legally) to MP57. We WILL be changing train operations that WE ALL will follow. Will take couple of weeks to finalize forms.

All these changes will make for safer and improved operations as our Museum grows. Growing pains means we are getting Better.

We did operate the museum during meetings and had an est. of 41 attending museum and some taking rides. We will be having more planning time on Saturday mornings so please help when you can with tours, displays and train. Motorman had to look for crew members several times before he could make runs.

Yes, we are starting to correct job titles. No engineers, now Motorman, conductor now Fireman and there will be more changes. You will be informed with updates during classes. We will be improving. Growing Pains are good tell you that you are learning and improving.

03-22-2025 - NICE WEATHER FOR OPERATIONS. We had a rather nice turnout for the day with a total estimate of 49 attending. Our train made three limited runs, only to Mills Drive due to pipe line construction and the defective switch on main street.

The pipe line construction will be disruptive to the area for next couple of weeks, If you see damage to our museum by construction crews please email me.

Museum operations: We are making almost daily changes to our operations, this is due to receiving permission to return to MP57 with LYT. But we have to make many changes to operations following county, state, FRA and CSX requirements, before we can return to 57. Several of our members are putting in a LOT of time and work making sure we understand and comply with all requirements. There will be changes each Saturday Morning concerning train operations for a while, be sure you understand "train operation" each Saturday morning. "If train excursions are given track clearance we need to have it ready to leave station by 9:20am. Do not leave station until you know what track you have clearance for and do not pass that point.

We all need to work together and have patience with changes that will be coming up. None of us like changes but we will grow stronger and our future will be much improved. Growing in knowledge of railroad operations.
