Weston, MA - The New England Intercollegiate Swimming and Diving Association Championships took place February 13-16, 2020 at the University of Rhode Island. The following are the 2020 Women's Championship Award recipients:

Kay Fromer Senior High Point Swimmer:

Kay Fromer was the women's coach at Southern Connecticut State University from 1968-1980 and first president of the NEWISDA (New England Women's Swimming and Diving Association). Kay's teams were dominant in the late sixties and seventies.

Bruce Hutchinson Swimmer of the Meet:

Bruce Hutchinson founded Southern Connecticut State University's swim program in 1960. Hutchinson led his teams to 36 consecutive winning seasons and more than 100 All-Americans and seven NCAA champions. The pool at Moore Fieldhouse was named the Bruce Hutchinson Natatorium on Feb. 7, 1997.

Charles Silvia Women's Swim Coach of the Year:

Charles (Red) Silvia was the Coach of Springfield College from 1937 until 1978. He coached more than 200 All-American swimmers and an Olympic gold medal winner during his 41 years at Springfield College. Springfield was a dominant team in New England swimming for years. He himself won a New England championship and set several college records while an undergraduate.

Charles Batterman was a former national diving champion and Coach of MIT diving team from 1956-1987 and the author of "the Techniques of Springboard Diving."
