

This new framework from <u>GFI</u> and <u>FAIRR</u> introduces a comprehensive set of standards for alternative protein companies to assess and disclose broader and deeper ESG data—spanning environmental, social, and economic impacts—that investors, governments, companies, and consumers should consider to make informed decisions.

## Meet a Protein Innovator- Robin Young, Manitoba Agriculture

As Director of the Value Added Branch in Manitoba Agriculture, Robin provides leadership to the Food Development Centre and the Business Development Unit. The Branch mandate is to grow the food industry in Manitoba, through business and market development consulting and initiatives, as well as research and development services for protein-focused companies of all sizes. Robin shared her thoughts on how the plant protein sector is advancing and what lies ahead.

- Who inspires you within the plant protein sector in the Cdn Prairies/Midwest region?
  - My team inspires me with their innovative thinking, problem-solving and client centric focus on service excellence. They take pride in seeing our clients succeed in their business ventures.
- What do you see as the 'next big thing' in plant protein?
  - There are actually several 'big things' in front of us including new types of plant proteins evolving on the market including those that are sourced and created in Manitoba including fava beans, hemp, canola, oat, etc. I also see recognition of the circular economy and the use of co-products to support the livestock sector. Consumers are looking for good taste and texture with a clean label and Manitoba has an opportunity to answer the demand.
- What is needed to make this happen?
  - To succeed, we need to introduce these proteins to the consumer and build their trust in the technology and the sustainability story inherent in prairie crops. Novel proteins also require regulatory considerations and the development of new food applications.
- What new plant protein did you eat/cook with this past year? Any tips/watch outs to share?
  - I recently tried our locally produced cricket powder in some applications at home and found them to be easy to include in a variety of baked goods as well as smoothies.
