



# BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS TRAINING RECAP

## BEACH SHOPS

### PURPOSE

The purpose of bloodborne pathogens training is to keep employees safe in the workplace from exposures to bloodborne diseases that can cause illness or death. Bloodborne pathogens are viruses or bacteria that can cause disease and infection which can be spread through blood and bodily fluids.

 The training will be executed annually, same process will apply at the time of recertification.

 Required by Cal/OSHA (Occupational Health and Safety Administration) for employees of certain industries to maintain health and safety.



#### HEPATITIS B CONSENT FORM

#### WHAT'S IN THE CADDY?

- Citra Cide Spray to sanitize
- PPE: Gloves (in all sizes), disposable aprons and goggles
- Biohazard bags
- Wet floor signs
- Caution cones
- Absorbent spill powder
- Broom with dustpan



#### HOW TO USE BIOHAZARD BUCKET

- Avoid touching the bin as this will contaminate it
  - Place bag in bin first then proceed to collecting the spill
- Absorbent spill powder should only be used if there is a liquid that needs to be picked up (i.e. blood, vomit etc.)
- Shattered glass/solids should be picked up with broom and dustpan



#### PROPER GLOVE REMOVAL

- Pinch the base of one glove and slowly peel it off. Hold it in the gloved hand.
- Slip two fingers inside the other glove and carefully peel it off.
- End with the gloves inside out, one inside the other.
- Dispose of them properly.
