Epiphany of the Lord — Deacon Jerome Bettencourt

"Epiphany" is the Christian feast commemorating the manifestation of Christ to the gentiles in the persons of the Magi. It takes place on the twelfth and last day of the Christmas season. The word "epiphany" can also mean the appearance of God. The most common use of the word is to describe a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of the truth. This is usually initiated by some simple or commonplace experience. The Magi find the baby Jesus in a manger, a very common place indeed. Yet they see in this encounter an amazingly tangible manifestation of God. Epiphany seems to have two connotations. In the first, God breaks into our lives in an act of revelation. In the second, we discover the divine in the midst of our ordinary daily lives. The readings for this Sunday help us to see the true meaning of epiphany.

In the passage from Isaiah the prophet describes the world as obscured in darkness. Only in Jerusalem is there light, and the city shines forth as a beacon for the rest of the world. After their long exile, the people are promised that God will return their nation to its former glory. The Lord will manifest His presence through them. As Christians, we see this prophecy fulfilled in Jesus Christ. The incarnation of God into this world takes place in Judea among the Jews. It is a sign that is so powerful that it has drawn people from every nation to recognize the manifestation of God among us in the person of Jesus. The words of Isaiah clearly present this as an act of God on behalf of the Jewish people, yet for the benefit of all humanity.

In Paul's Epistle to the Ephesians, the apostle explains that his ministry came from the mystery revealed to him in his encounter with Jesus Christ. He reminds the Ephesians that this revelation was not offered to the generations of the past but is made clear to them and the generations to come through the Gospel. As in the first reading, this is a benefit extended to the whole world making the Gentiles coheirs to the covenant God made with the Jewish community at the time of Abraham.

The Gospel of Matthew presents the story of the three magi. These foreign scholars are drawn to Judea by a star illuminating a great event. They describe this as the birth of a new king of the Jews which puts Herod into a panic. Herod assembles his priests and scribes to ascertain exactly where this sign was to take place. They tell Herod of the prophecy made about Bethlehem. He asks the magi about the time of the star's appearance and then sends them there. The Magi are led by the star to the place where Mary and Joseph were staying. The moment they see the child, they pay Him homage and present their gifts to the Christ child.

We can see that the Epiphany is an act of God. It is through divine prerogative that Christ is reveled to us in our lives. While we often experience this encounter through simple events in our daily lives, the revelation is the result of God's love for us. Christ finds us in the commonplace events of our lives and shows us His grace. The proper response to this epiphany is gratitude which is best expressed when we become heralds of the Gospel in the world.


