The 2nd Sunday of Easter – Lectionary A (4-12-26)

Our readings on this second Sunday of Easter teach us how the Church is the legacy of the Resurrection Event we celebrate in this liturgical season. Our existence as a community is born of this event, and for this reason, we commemorate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ each year in the most solemn of celebrations and continue to reflect on it each and every Sunday of our lives.

In the Acts of the Apostles, the evangelist Luke gives a moving description of the early Church. The community devoted themselves to the teachings of Jesus. They celebrated, as a family, the Christ’s sacrifice in the ritual of the breaking of the bread. The community shared their possessions with one another so that none would suffer in need. They lived their lives in praise of God and sincerity of heart, and as a result, many wonders and signs were accomplished in their midst. Every day more were drawn into this circle of love born of God’s sacrifice. We are the heirs of this humble beginning. As such, we must strive to imitate this love and devotion and open the door for God to accomplish signs in our midst, drawing others into our circle of love.

In first letter of Saint Peter, the Apostle explains how the resurrection gave us new lives through a living hope of our redemption. Peter describes this as our inheritance, kept for us in heaven perpetually, undefiled, incorruptible, and unfading in its glory. This inheritance is safeguarded in this life through faith, given to us as a gift from God. This faith helps us endure the trials and tribulations of our lives and is strengthened through these struggles. Peter is speaking to us when he writes, “although you have not seen Jesus as we did you love him; and though you do not see Him now as he was present to us you believe in Him.” The apostle explains that this trust, and the joy it brings, is the vehicle of our salvation.

In John’s Gospel, we hear how a remnant Jesus’ disciples sat huddled behind locked doors, traumatized and afraid. They feared that they would be arrested by the same people who murdered their master and suffer His fate. They have heard about the empty tomb and how Jesus had appeared to Mary Magdalene; but they remain unsure. Suddenly, Jesus appears in their midst and reveals to them that he has been resurrected and they rejoice. The Lord then breathes on them that they may receive the Holy Spirit. Thomas, who was not there when this event occurred, refused to believe it until he saw it for himself. A little later Jesus appears to them again. This time the doubting Thomas is present. Jesus approaches Thomas and bids him to shed his doubt and believe. Thomas repents of his skepticism and says to Jesus, “My Lord and my God.” Jesus then proclaims, “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.” Like the teaching given in Peter’s letter, this verse is aimed at us.

This Sunday our readings reveal to us that the Church is the legacy of the resurrection. This is our inheritance, which is perpetuated through faith. The faith we have is a trust in what is unseen by our eyes and yet experienced in our hearts. All are invited into this circle of love we call the Church. Within this circle we have access to heaven in the next life.

Divine Mercy Sunday 2026

This feast occurs annually on the second Sunday of Easter and concludes the Octave of Easter.

Requirements for the Feast

To properly observe the Feast of Divine Mercy and receive its associated extraordinary graces—often described as a "complete forgiveness of sins and punishment"—the faithful are typically asked to:

- **Sincerely Repent:** Express true sorrow for all sins.
- **Go to Confession:** The Sacrament of Reconciliation should be received either on the day or within a few days (often cited as up to 20 days) before or after the feast.
- **Receive Holy Communion:** Participate in Mass and receive the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday or its Saturday Vigil.
- **Venerate the Divine Mercy Image:** Honor the image of Jesus with the inscription "Jesus, I Trust in You".
