



SUNDAY CONNECTION

Luke 12:13-21 A person's life does not consist of possessions.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to remember that the goods of the world are intended to be shared by all. this man in today's Gospel isn't bad, Jesus points out but his main flaw was that he was thinking only about himself and his own comfort and security. When we fail to think about the needs of others, we call that a sin of omission.

The parable, a rich man's lands have yielded more crops than expected. His response is not to consider how he might share all the extra food with others but to wonder how he can possibly store it all. He has what he thinks is a brilliant idea: to tear down his present barns and build larger ones. Then he will have many things stored up for years of eating, drinking, and making merry.

"You fool" is God's response to this man because that very night his life will be taken away. To whom will everything belong then, God asks. The rich man's world is small, just him and his possessions, and now he learns that he is to lose his life. What good are his possessions now? Jesus states the moral of the story. This is how it will be for everyone who stores up treasure for himself or herself but is not rich in what matters to God.

Centuries later St. Gregory the Great taught that when we care for the needs of the poor, we are giving them what is theirs, not ours. We are not just performing works of mercy; we are paying a debt of justice. Life does not consist in possessions but in sharing what we possess with others. The goods of the earth have been given to everyone.

Food Pantry July Distribution

Sacred Heart Food Pantry was able to serve 125 children, adults and kupuna on July 17, 2025.

The Food Basket distribution this month, consisted primarily of frozen foods, rice and fresh eggplants and bananas, very little dry goods. Their supplies of USDA goods are minimal as funds to feed the hungry has shrunken.

It is more than ever important for us as parish ohana to help support our pantry with food. Thank you to all of you who came through with canned foods, breakfast foods, fresh produce, snacks and other goods. Your efforts and donations are very much appreciated.

A big MAHALO to all the volunteers who give of their time and energy. A lot of prep work goes into preparing for distribution day. There's the intake of foods to organize and store, making sure there's enough bags to put the food in. On the Wednesday, day before distribution, volunteers gather to make all the bags of food for distribution on Thursday. Day of distribution we service all the clients with bags of food, frozen, fresh, and dry goods. The day usually ends after clean up with a potluck luncheon for all the volunteers.

If anyone feels drawn to participate, help is always welcomed.
