The Feast of the Holy Family - Lectionary A (12-28-25)	
<p>Trust is the foundation of every human relationship. We initially learn how to engage in relationships through our families. Consequently, healthy living in a family requires compassion, humility and patience. Relationships require respect and gentle kindness. The natural occurrence of misunderstanding and conflict, often by-products of family relationships, can cause us frustration and pain. The only cure for this problem is trust. As we celebrate this Christmas season and commemorate Jesus’ entry into the world, we reflect on His entry into our lives, and we must allow the love He brings to overflow in our hearts to flow over the people closest to us, our family and friends. It is this love, a force which can transcend conflict and tragedy, that serves as the theme for the readings of this Sunday’s celebration.</p> <p>In the first reading from Sirach, we are urged to respect our parents. Sirach teaches that showing honor one’s father and mother makes up for our sins. The virtues that flow from devotion to your parents are humility, faith, and love. These qualities were always praised by Jesus in the Gospels. The foundation of a healthy family life is marked by this kind of moral strength when it is exercised by both parents and children alike. We are reminded that we can avoid family conflict and even correct painful mistakes when we act out these virtues.</p> <p>In Paul’s letter to the Colossians, the Apostle urges us to treat one another with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. He reminds his audience and us that we have been admitted into the Body of Christ, the Church, through the forgiveness of our sins. Therefore, we should, in gratitude, extend that grace to each other. We are members of one family: a family of believers. We are not perfect, but we are forgiven and to honor this gift we must be willing to bestow that grace to one another.</p> <p>The Gospel reading from Matthew tells the story of how Joseph is guided by God to protect his family. Joseph, the Husband of Mary, is guided by God through dreams. Like Joseph in the Book of Genesis, these dreams ultimately lead to the protection and salvation of a family. This Gospel passage is teaching us that God is willing to guide each of us in our family interactions to preserve the bond we share with the people closest to us.</p> <p>In this season of Christmas, as we celebrate and commemorate the coming of God into our world and into our lives, we reflect on the example set for us by the Holy Family. We are reminded that humility and love help to heal the mistakes we have made. We are urged to show gratitude for the graces we have been given by extending forgiveness to others. Finally we are assured of God’s help to sustain and preserve the bonds which connect us as family and as Church.</p>
