Sunday Connection

Luke 3:1-6

John preaches repentance and baptizes in the region of the Jordan.

In today's Gospel reading, John the Baptist is presented as the figure who bridges the time before Christ and prepares the way for Christ's own ministry.

John the Baptist appears in the tradition of the great prophets, preaching repentance and reform to the people of Israel. John baptizes for repentance and for forgiveness of sins, preparing the way for God's salvation.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus, we too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives the coming of the Lord, as John did.

John the Baptist reminds us that our repentance is another way in which we can prepare for the Lord's coming and our celebration of Christmas. Sacred Heart Parish offers a communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Advent season on December 10, 2021. You might want to choose to participate in the communal celebration of the sacrament, or make it a family Advent event.

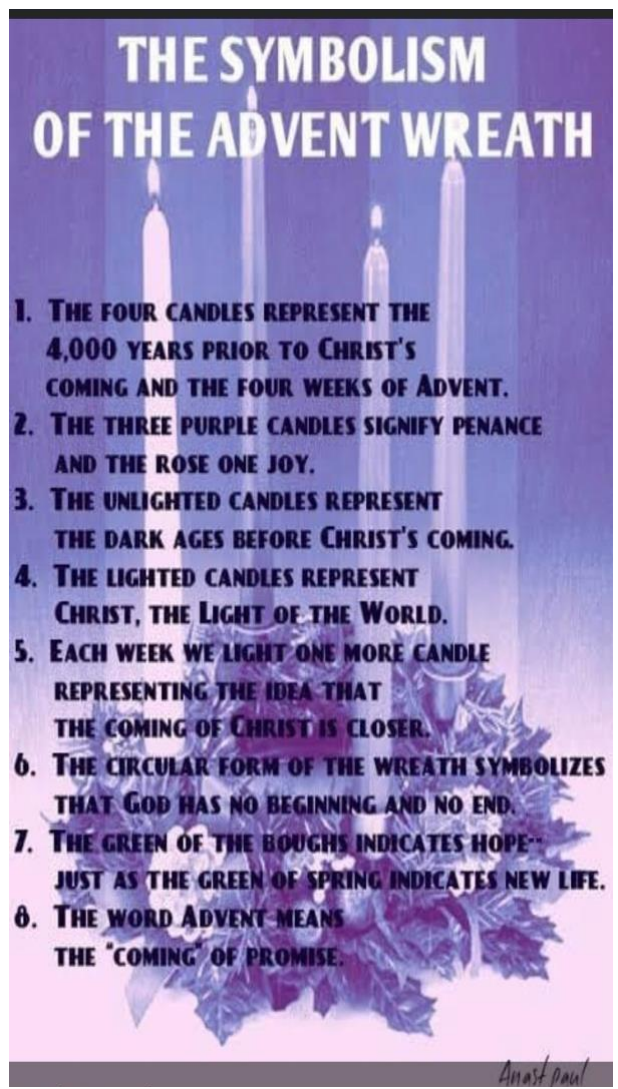

OUTREACH**

Every year Sacred Heart Parish do Christmas outreach to our community with toys and food. Toys are distributed in conjunction with Christmas Food Pantry pick up. Those who have registered when getting food these past months will also receive toys for their children. For the month of November our Sacred Heart Parish Food Pantry fed a total of 304 people. There were 67 children, 133 adults, and 104 senior citizens. Our Kalapana Food Pantry fed 121 people, 28 were children, 56 adults and 37 seniors. Your participation to help feed the hungry helps to do what Jesus asks of us, to feed the poor.

SYNOD Continuation from last week’s Bulletin

KEY QUESTION:

How can all the members of the Catholic Church be more effective in proclaim the living Jesus Christ to the world?

**Diocesan Phase in the Diocese of Honolulu
October 17, 2021-February 28, 2022**

There are ten Themes to be used as starting points and guidelines. Themes will continue for the next few weeks. This week is one question. Please give this question some thought. Have discussions in groups, in your home, in your workplace, the objective is to be inclusive as possible. Summarize responses and email to <https://bit.ly/SynodResponses>. Combined reports will be collated and sent to the Vatican in preparation for the October 2023 Synod of Bishops where representative bishops from throughout the world will convene and meet with our Holy Father.

7. ECUMENISM *The dialogue between Christmas of different confessions, united by one baptism, has a special place in the synodal journey.* What relationship does our Church community have with members of other Christian traditions and denominations? What do we share and how do we journey together? What fruits have we drawn from walking together? What are the difficulties? How can we take the next step in walking forward with each other?

8. AUTHORITY AND PARTICIPATION A synodal church is a participatory and co-responsible Church. How does our Church community identify the goals to be pursued, the way to reach them, and steps to be taken? How is authority or governance exercised within our local Church? How are teamwork and co responsibility put into practice? How are evaluations conducted and by whom? How are lay people promoted? Have we had fruitful experiences of synodality on a local level? How do synodal bodies function at the level of the local Church (Pastoral Councils in parishes and dioceses, Presbyteral Council, etc.?) How can we foster a more synodal approach in our participation and leadership?
