



4th Sunday of Ordinary Time – Lectionary A (02-01-26) - Dcn Jerome Bettencourt
 Entering a relationship with God requires that we must learn to listen to the whispers of the Holy Spirit and submit to God's will. To do this we must build within us a capacity for trust and reliance on God's Grace. This may seem hard at first, but when we take these steps, we find ourselves centered, effective, and fulfilled. We can be tempted to think that the gifts we receive from God emanates from inside us; that we have complete control. We can be misled into thinking that these gifts are instruments of our will rather than tools to accomplish the will of God. Once we start down this path, we begin to lose our success, our satisfaction, and ultimately, our very selves. The only escape from this trap is humility. Humility is not a matter of self-loathing, but a realistic view of our place in creation. As a wise man once said, "True humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less."

This Sunday, the word of God teaches us about humility. In the reading from Zephaniah, the prophet describes humility as a key to survival in the face of God's wrath. He points out that humility makes it possible to draw close to God and follow His will. Zephaniah teaches that it is this relationship which will save the people from the coming disaster. He describes humility as key to this covenant. The prophet describes a humble remnant who will survive the trial and take refuge in God's name. Their humility will see them through because they will rely on God rather than their own strength. We know that God can accomplish so much more than our limited capacity, humility gives us access to this protection. In the passage from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, the apostle is urging the Christian community of Corinth to humility. He reminds them that, before their call, they were not particularly prosperous, gifted, or powerful. Paul argues that this is the reason God reached out to them. God chooses the lowly because in their humility they will rely on Him. The apostle teaches that the true power within the Church of Corinth begins and ends in the connection to Christ. Therefore, if they must boast about something, they should only boast of their relationship with Jesus. If we truly know ourselves, we have no choice but acknowledge the benefit of being connected to God. This is the heart of humility.

Today's passage from Matthew's Gospel contains the "Beatitudes," a title given to this portion of the Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes consist of eight blessings phrased in the form of proverbs. The central message of these proverbs can be summarized as: "Happy are those who rely on God; for they will never be abandoned." Humbleness is the prerequisite for such trust in God. Jesus is teaching that, in contrast with the world's obsession with power, it is the humble who have the advantage.

In the Book of Proverbs, wisdom is defined as "Fear of the Lord," or respect for God's place in the universe. Humility is an authentic evaluation of our own place in this universe. These are two sides of the same coin. So, while respect for God is the beginning of all wisdom
 (Proverbs 9:10), its end is humility.
