Baptism of the Lord — Lectionary A (1-11-2025)

In order for Jesus to be born “like one of us in all things but sin,” He had to relinquish some of his divine power. Jesus is God, but in human form. He was not omniscient. Like us, He had to learn and discover things. One of the most important things a human can learn is his or her vocation. Jesus discovers this vocation at His baptism. He would have certainly been aware of the fact that He was special. The family stories alone would have taught Him that. Yet it is at His baptism that Jesus learns that He is the Messiah. This is confirmed by Jesus himself who, after this event, begins His ministry. In our celebration of this event we remember the moment Jesus accepted his vocation, and we reflect on our own calling. The readings this Sunday remind us that we too are called to play a role in the salvation of the world.

Isaiah’s prophecy speaks of a servant “with whom God is well pleased.” This man will be anointed to bring justice on Earth. He will do this with gentleness, and all will eagerly seek his teachings. As Christians we see this fulfilled in Jesus. He embodied a covenant between God and humanity that extended well beyond the Jewish community to encompass every nation on Earth. Jesus healed the blind and freed people from many oppressive diseases and handicaps. Most importantly, He was and is a light in the darkness of this world. Jesus guides us home to the safety and comfort of the Kingdom of God. We are called shine this light throughout the world. Our vocation as Christians is to bear the light of Christ and share it with everyone we encounter in our lives

In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter tells the household of Cornelius, a newly accepted Gentile Christian, that God shows no partiality in the salvation conferred through Jesus Christ. He assures them that whoever accepts God with respect and acts uprightly will share in the kingdom. Peter explains that though the covenant God made through Jesus began in the Jewish community, it is now extended to the Gentiles. The light of Christ pulls at the hearts of all humanity urging them to come home to be with God in paradise.

The story of Jesus’ baptism found in the Gospel of Matthew contains a dialogue between John the Baptist and Jesus. At first John refuses to baptize his cousin, yet Jesus insists. When He rises from the baptismal waters, the heavens are open to Him. At that moment a voice is heard saying, “this is my Son with whom I am well pleased.” For any Jew familiar with the writings of Isaiah, the implication is clear; Jesus is the Messiah! It is important to recognize that while all may have heard this voice, few accepted its implication. Some who were there did become followers of Jesus, but others did not. The same is true of our personal vocation. While all may hear the call, few have the courage to embrace it.

In the Baptism of the Lord we see how Jesus discovers his vocation. We are reminded of our own calling as Christians. In many varied ways and in a multitude of different circumstances we are expected to spread the light of Christ into this very dark world. In times when we lack the nerve to embrace this commission, we only need to look to Jesus to inspire us. We are not asked to be perfect but to give our best effort. Our greatest hope is that, at the end of our lives, as we stand at the gates of Heaven, we will hear the voice of God say of us: “This is my child, with whom I am well pleased.”
