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3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time - A - (01-25-26)

We are raised as children to develop the strength to control ourselves and our surroundings. This quest to self-direct our lives and author our own fate often leads us into conflict with others. The French philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre describes this phenomenon in his play *No Exit*. The supposition asserted in this drama is that “Hell is --other people.” In contrast, this Sunday’s readings teach us the wisdom of surrendering our will to God.

In the first reading, taken from Isaiah, the prophet describes the restoration the northern tribes of Israel who were the first to fall to the Assyrian invasion and exile. According to Isaiah, they will be freed but this will be accomplished by God’s will and not through the people’s initiative. These people will see a great light. This passage is the beginning of Isaiah’s “Prince of Peace” prophecy and the sign which King Ahaz refused to accept (Isaiah 7:11-14). Ahaz had made his own plans and did not want God’s help. Ultimately this rejection led to disaster for him and his kingdom. It is also important to note that the area named in this passage is the place where Jesus begins his earthly ministry, as we will be reminded in today’s Gospel passage.

The passage from Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle urges the Corinthians to abandon their foolish rivalries based on the minister who baptized them. Paul points out that they were not baptized in the name of these men, but in the name of Christ Jesus. He reminds them that it was Jesus, not these ministers, who died for them on the cross. In their quest to establish dominance over each other, the Corinthians have made idols of the ministers who brought them the Gospel. Paul rejects this distinction and urges the Corinthians to do the same. He explains that he was not called to start his own church, the church of Paul; he is an apostle of Jesus Christ. It is His will that Paul serves. To do otherwise would deny the redemption bought with Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross. When we reject the will of God to assert our own plans, we rob ourselves of the gifts God has provided to save us.

The Gospel passage from Matthew reminds us that Jesus began his ministry in the same area described in the first reading from Isaiah. It describes Jesus’s message as one of repentance and the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. Here we see the call of first apostles and their willingness to follow Jesus. In this passage, these fishermen exemplify the abandonment of our personal plans to follow the will of God. Peter, Andrew, James and John were hard at work, executing the plan by which they fed themselves and their families. Yet, at Jesus’s call, they drop everything and surrender to God’s will. Unwilling to forfeit their call, they leave their lives and their plans to follow Christ. They become the pillars of the Church, and we are richer for their sacrifice.

It is difficult to give up control and surrender our will to God’s plan. Renunciation to serve God runs counter our culture and upbringing. Yet, to put our plans before God’s will results in the forfeiture of our salvation. Hell is --losing this gift. May we have the strength and wisdom of the apostles to surrender our plans and follow Jesus’ call.
