11<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time -A (06-14-2026) Deacon Jerome Bettencourt

The scriptures for this Sunday’s celebration describe how the compassion of God calls us all to pay forward the love showered upon us by sending us forth into the world to accomplish God’s will. Today’s readings help us to remember that our faith is not a passive act of acceptance but a calling to seek to fulfill the will of God in our lives to shine the light of compassion into the darkness.

In the Book of Exodus, we are told the story of Moses receiving the law of the covenant from God. The commandments are given to forge the Israelites into their role as God’s Chosen People. This story follows Moses’ commission of elders to help govern the nation which implies that the law comes with a commission for the people to be an example in the world. Knowing the stubborn nature of the people, Moses begs God to travel with them. The Lord agrees to Moses’ request out of compassion for their weakness.

In today’s reading from Romans, Paul explains the compassion of Christ in sacrificing Himself for a weak and sinful Human race. The Apostle reminds us of the fact that Jesus died to save us even while we remained in sin. If Jesus was that generous to us when we did not even know him, how much more will we gain by being His disciples. Paul implies that our reconciliation with God through Christ’s sacrifice inspires us to faith, hope and love.

This Sunday’s Gospel passage, from Matthew follows several healing miracles that made Jesus well known throughout Galilee. The crowds gather around Him thirsting for another miracle. These healings have ignited deep desire for signs of God’s love to give them hope. Jesus shows compassion for their need by choosing twelve of His disciples to go out and heal the people. The word “apostle” means “one who is sent. Jesus sends the twelve out to spread this hope throughout Galilee. The apostles are initially sent to the lost sheep of Israel, yet later that commission will expand. Today we, as disciples of Christ, are also sent out to inspire hope in the world through our acts of love and care for the most vulnerable within our society.

The scriptures reveal to us that God’s compassion, while freely given without price, is always accompanied by a call to service. When we embrace this call, our appreciation and capacity to enjoy God’s love is enhanced and deepened within our lives. This Sunday we reflect on the fact that every gift received from God is given with the intention that we share God’s love to others, and we marvel at the great compassion revealed in this truth.
