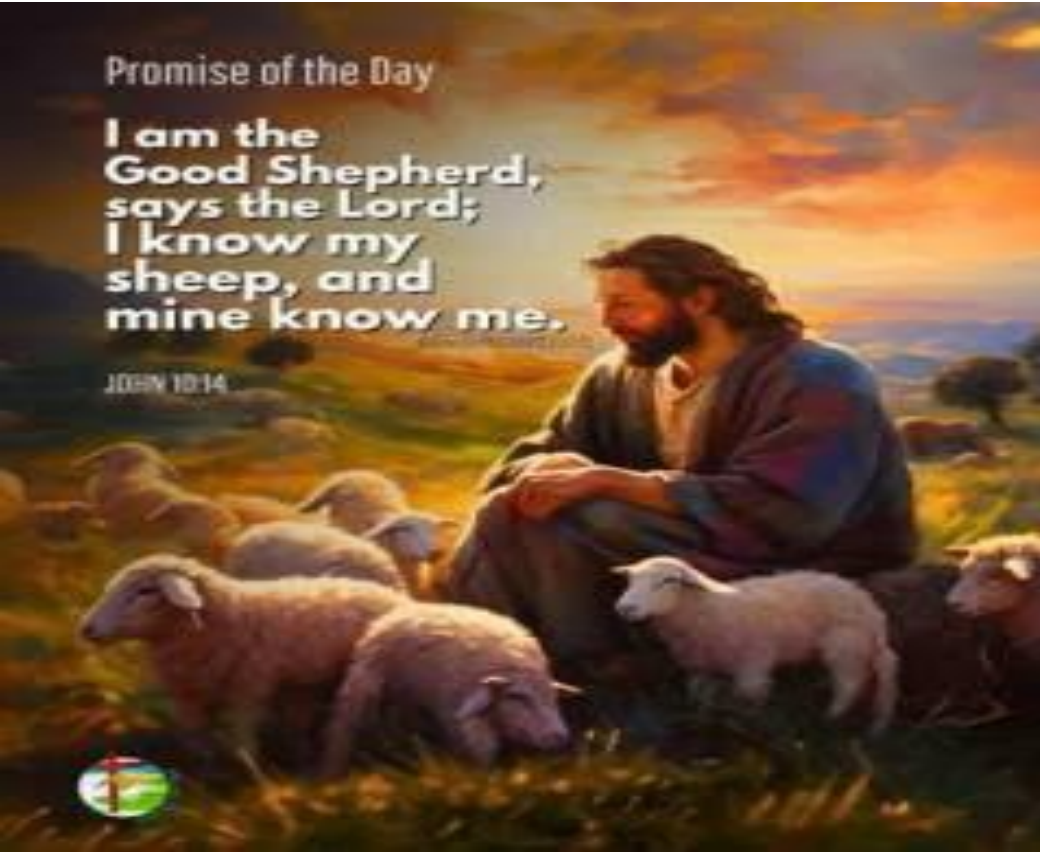

**“Though we walk in death’s shadow, we fear no evil”**

This world can be a dangerous place, filled with threats and littered with obstacles designed to keep us from God. While clinging to our faith and hope of salvation, we may experience adversity and persecution from others. Today’s readings help us to remember that Christ is with us – always -- to the end of time and that we only need to turn to Him to be delivered from our sufferings.

In the Book of Jeremiah, the prophet exemplifies the proper attitude towards adversity and persecution. In this passage, Jeremiah describes the pain of being betrayed by people who once called him their friend. This demonstrates the fate of any prophet tasked with the duty to deliver God’s plan and message to a people who have already made up their minds about what they want to do. The world often rejects the message of God, principally when it contradicts its culture and values. When that message poses a real threat to those in power, it most likely leads to the martyrdom of the messenger. Jeremiah is mindful of this, and despite the adversity, clings to his trust in God for ultimate vindication. We can learn from this example and be brave in the face of such hardships.

In today’s reading from Paul’s Letter to the Romans, the apostle explains that it was through the disobedience of Adam that we find ourselves in a world suffused with sin and death. The adversity and pain we feel in this life are a direct result of our separation from God. Paul insists, however, that the gift of our salvation in Christ is not the consequence our actions but rather is the effect of God’s gift of Himself for our redemption. He argues that this world is not necessarily our fate. God gives us a way home through our relationship with Jesus Christ. Just as Jeremiah’s relationship with God gave him the strength to endure, our bond to Jesu gives us the hope and fortitude to withstand the disappointments of life in this world.

In Matthew’s Gospel, Jesus urges the disciples not to fear the perils of this world. The Lord reminds his disciples that no act of persecution against us is forgotten. He instructs us not to fear that which can only hurt our bodies and tells us to dread anything which bars our path to salvation. Jesus teaches that the love of God for us knows no bounds and, as long as we cling to that love, we will be saved. Jesus is the embodiment of God’s love. If we acknowledge and treasure our relationship with Him, we will abide in that love. When we feel the bitter sting of disappointment, it is usually the consequence of sin. Whether it be due to our personal rejection of God or the alienation of others from Him, the remedy is the same. We must turn to God and abide in His love. We must allow that love to fill us with hope and imbue within us the strength to endure in a world which is simultaneously sustained by God, and yet, remains separated from its creator.
