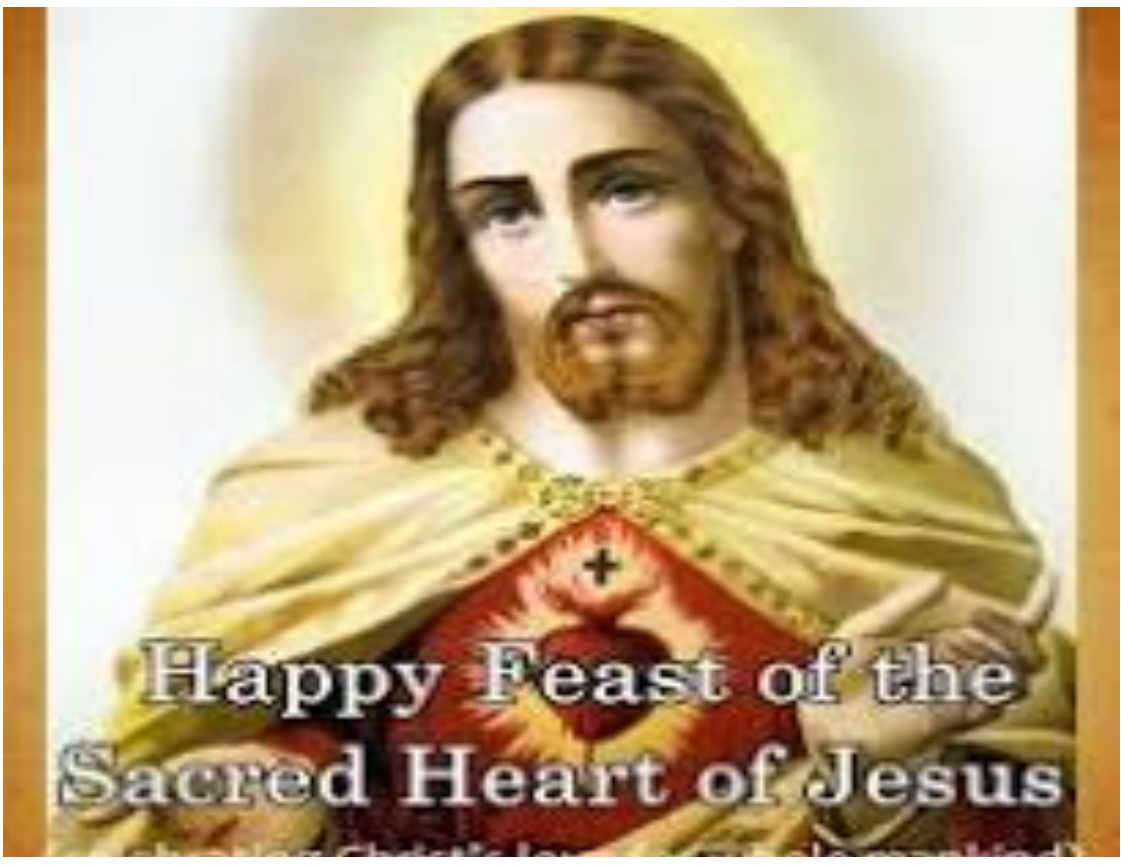

13<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time – Lectionary A (6-28-26)

There are many things in this life which can demand our attention and occupy our time. In fact, it is easy to get overwhelmed by the people and situations which require time and active participation. As we grow into adulthood, we learn that the management of time requires that we set priorities for our attention and effort. Common wisdom teaches that the measure of success we enjoy, or failure we endure, in life depends on the quality of these priorities. This Sunday’s readings offer us the criteria found in scripture.

In the Book of Kings, we hear the story of the wealthy woman of Shunem and her kindness towards the prophet Elisha. This lady is described as a “woman of influence.” Whenever he would visit the town she always offered him dinner. She came to recognize Elisha as a holy man, and extending her hospitality, prepared a place for him to stay when he visited her home. The woman and her husband asked nothing of the prophet and were simply showing gratitude to God by caring for one of his servants. Moved by the generosity of this woman, Elisha asks one of her servants if there is any way he could help her. The servant explains that, though prosperous, the woman has no children, and her husband is quite old. The Prophet calls the woman and prophesies that within a year she will have a son. This story illustrates that God always responds to our generosity and love, especially when we honor him by caring for one another.

In Paul’s Letter to the Romans, the apostle clarifies that baptism involves a death to worldly comforts and a spiritual rebirth to a new life in Christ. Paul describes this change of heart as the way we become able to embrace salvation. If we die to the world, we are resurrected in Jesus Christ. By placing our relationship with Jesus first, we can concentrate, without distraction, on the will of God. We become dead to sin and turn our lives towards God, strengthened in our relationship with Jesus Christ. This requires a radical shift of our values and the establishment of new priorities in our lives.

In Matthew’s Gospel, Jesus warns that discipleship demands that we put Him first. If we are unwilling to make Christ the ultimate priority in our lives, we make ourselves unworthy of salvation and may find redemption just beyond our reach. This kind of dedication always involves a cost, yet this sacrifice will not leave us forsaken because it bonds us to God. Jesus goes on to teach the method by which we live out this dedication. The primary way we live out this dedication is by caring for one another. When we seek the will of Christ, we will always be led to love each other more deeply. Such service done without this devotion, often leads to corruption and exploitation. When we make the kingdom of God a priority, we experience greater success and satisfaction in our lives.

The scriptures this Sunday teach us the criteria we need to find peace and joy in this life. By clinging to Christ, we affirm our salvation and accept the gift of our redemption. This heavenly priority compels us to love each other for God’s sake and not simply for our own benefit.

Aloha Parish 'Ohana!

Time runs fast! We are now celebrating the 97th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Village Church and 128 years ago our parish was established when a church, dedicated to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, was built downtown Pāhoa in 1898. In 1933, the wood of the old Pāhoa church was used to build the church of

Mary, Star of the See at Kalapana.

All of us inherited a wonderful history of our Catholic life. Our ancestors have paved a road for us so that we may have a place of worship, a place of community, a place where God deigns to dwell! As we celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the Arrival of the First Catholic Missionaries to Hawai'i, we may now realize that what has been entrusted to us is not just a tangible building but something much more precious and important. The Church was first "built" in the hearts of believers before it took shape into wooden beams and iron roofings. While the kānaka were naturally hospitable, the Catholic missionaries did not find it easy to propose the Catholic Faith. They believed however in the native saying: Uwē ka lani; ola ka honua. The Catholic missionaries took every opportunity to find grace in everything Hurry up! Look up and see the first translations in ka 'Ōlelo Hawai'i of the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary and other Marian Antiphons and Hymns on the walls of Mary, Star of the Sea Church. See them before the fury of history deletes them!

It is all up to us to be guardians of history. Our love for our parish reflects our love to the One Who wants to live herein. I thank you all for this love! I hold with high appreciation all the many volunteers and benefactors of our church. Many of these volunteers and benefactors work and give in silence that only the God who sees in secret can witness! May God bless you all! May God bless us all! Mahalo iā Ke Akua!

The pages of our history book are still to be continued. Though not official, we can now think about the completion of the hundred years of our church. And we, with our children's children, will continue to live by the heartbeats of the

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.
