SUNDAY CONNECTION

John 20:19-23

Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean from sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God in forgiving sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.

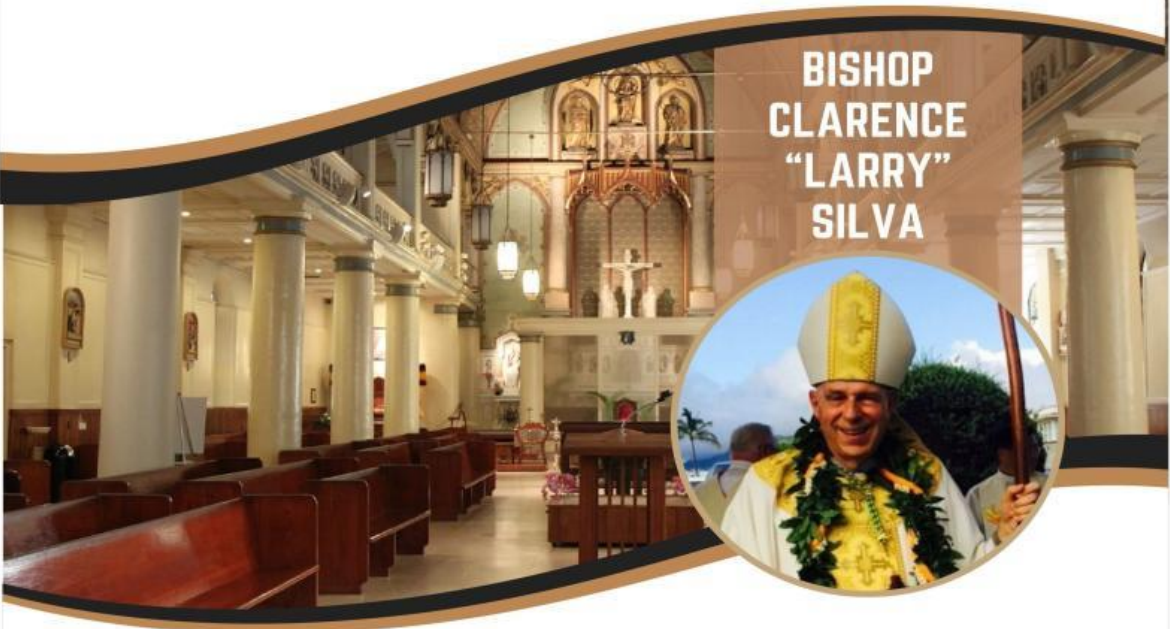

Aloha 40 DFL Pro-Life Friends!

First let me apologize for not being in much contact with all of you. This past Lent was truly a time of challenges, trials and crosses for many. It was indeed a sacrificial time which prepared us for the glory of Easter! I hope that the joy and blessing of the Resurrection continues to be with you!

Many heartfelt thanks to all of you who volunteered and prayed at the Hilo vigil site. Your commitment and courageous presence is testimony that there is a Culture of Life in our community. While we saw and heard some feedback, only God knows how many more were affected by your witness. Thank you also to those who were with us in spirit through your prayers.

Our local campaign this spring was safe and joyful. In keeping with the Statement of Peace, our volunteers kept to the ideal of being prayerful, friendly and helpful. During this spring campaign we were among 306 cities across the nation and over 660 cities world wide! 40 Days For Life campaigns continue to grow and in God’s time, we hope that campaigns against abortion will not be necessary.

Mark, Father Molina and I were able to meet with Dr. Donato Borrillo, Assistant General Counsel & Director of Medicolegal Affairs. Dr. Borrillo works a rotation as Ship Doctor aboard the cruise ship Pride of America which docks in Hilo every Tuesday. During our meeting, Dr. Borrillo imparted some insights regarding pro-life issues and emphasized keeping volunteers’ Statement of Peace current as well as the legal support available to 40 Days For Life vigil keepers if needed. Dr. Borrillo has also been meeting with our sister campaigns in Kona and Honolulu.

In support of pro-life efforts, we hosted Christian Alan Manuel, a Students For Life Regional Coordinator who visited UH Hilo to establish contacts, promote and try to start a Students For Life group. Also, Hilo 40 Days For Life offered the prayer for families at the National Day of Prayer Observance at Glad Tidings Church which was coordinated by Sharon Hutchison, Coordinator for Intercessors for America. We shall do what we can to further the pro-life movement.

He was a loving, quiet and prayerful man. We really missed him this past campaign. Pray and intercede for us Toribio!

This summer one of our most devoted vigil keepers, Bev Moodie will be leaving us for Virginia. Bev has been not only a prayer warrior but also a co-leader. With Bev's attentiveness to monitoring our 40 DFL communications, she flagged a plea for help. We were able to help save Baby Malakai. It was an interstate and inter campaign effort between 40 DFL Hilo and 40 DFL Ann Arbor, Michigan and with God's grace, a precious gift was not terminated. Thank you Jesus, thank you Bev!

We will have a potluck gathering to say aloha to Bev and celebrate life on June 22nd at 1:30ish PM at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church Hall in Pahoa after the Traditional Latin Mass.
