Palm Sunday (Second Sunday of the Passion – Deacon Jerome Bettencourt

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday with two Gospel proclamations which commemorate both Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and His passion on the cross. These two events are juxtaposed to highlight our human weakness just as the some of the same people who hailed Jesus as Messiah would be shouting for his execution only five days later. This contrast points out the truth about Jesus' mission and the real source of His victory. This marks the beginning of Holy Week in which we all relive the last days of our Lord culminating in His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

A passage from the book of the prophet Isaiah is our first reading. It is a prophecy about the suffering servant who heals the community through his own sacrifice and pain; it is the prophecy which Jesus fulfilled. The servant is described as a skillful speaker; Jesus speaks directly to our hearts and moves us to accept God's love. The servant listens to God; Jesus knows that this week will end with His death on a cross and yet He does not turn away. The servant submits to torture because he knows that God has his back; Jesus faces his passion with faith that He will not be put to shame. God's love for us is endless and it proves to be more powerful than death.

In the second reading, Paul teaches the Philippians about the humility of Jesus. The Apostle points out that Jesus did not come into the world robed in divine power but rather chose to approach us in human frailty. This humility found its culmination in His sacrifice on the cross which earned God's exaltation. Jesus is the focal point of all creation, the bridge between the physical and the spiritual realms. Through our confession of faith in him, he becomes our entry to Heaven.

This year the Gospel account of Jesus' passion is taken from Matthew's Gospel. The passage begins with the betrayal of Jesus by Judas Iscariot and proceeds to the account of Jesus' last supper. Later the Lord confronts Judas directly revealing that He is aware of the disciple's plan. After the institution of the Eucharistic ritual, Jesus explains that from now on, the apostles must exercise their authority through service to each other. When they reach the Mount of Olives, Jesus prays three times for the cup of suffering to pass from him. Judas enters with a crowd to betray the Lord with a kiss. At His trial, a parade of false witnesses gives testimony to the charge of blasphemy. Jesus is questioned by Caiaphas who condemns Him, and the torture begins. In the morning, Jesus is taken to Pilate to be sentenced to death. When Pilate questions Jesus he finds no evidence of a crime. When Pilate tries to release Jesus, a riot starts and Matthew tells the story of Pilate washing his hands of the affair. After Jesus is scourged, He is taken to Golgotha to be crucified. Matthew records that the moment of Jesus' death, many strange events occur in testimony of the tragedy that has just taken place. This symbolizes the vindication of Jesus, as well as God's displeasure.

In today's reliving of the Lord's Passion, we see at every turn, that Jesus is the Suffering Servant foretold in Isaiah's prophecy. He goes willingly to his death. Jesus gives no defense against the false testimony levelled against Him. He is led, like a sacrificial lamb to the slaughter, and after his death, Jesus is vindicated by God through His resurrection. Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem has, indeed, culminated in His glorification, but not in the way anyone would have expected. May God continue to surprise us through the coming Easter season.

What Is Palm Sunday and Why Do We Celebrate It?

One day each year in the spring, churches gather around the world and are given palm branches to wave. This beautiful service called Palm Sunday is one week prior to Easter. It is an incredible tradition, but why do Christians celebrate Palm Sunday? What is the purpose of raising branches? To an onlooker, this might appear to be a strange worship service. However, as we dive deeper into the meaning of this unique day, we can all gain a greater understanding of the value of celebrating and commemorating the victorious entrance of our King Jesus.

Palm Sunday was the first day of Holy Week leading up to the Jewish holiday of Passover. Jesus rode on a donkey through the town of Jerusalem on His way to conquer death and bring us life through His sacrifice on the cross.

According to [Christianity.com](https://www.christianity.com), "Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the remembrance of Jesus' last days to the cross. In many churches, Palm Sunday is observed by the blessing and sharing of palm branches symbolizing the palm branches the crowd placed in front of Christ as he entered into Jerusalem."

Palm Sunday is celebrated by the Christian community because it represents the victory that we have in Christ. A palm branch is a symbol of triumph, a banner of peace, and a physical representation of surrender to King Jesus as Lord. It is no command that we lift a palm branch in worship to the Lord, but it is a great delight to join those many years ago who shouted "Hosanna!" There is power in knowing that the same Jesus whom they celebrated in the streets, is the same Jesus who we celebrate today. They may have been in cloaks and we might be in blue jeans, but the tradition of preparing the way for our King still remains.
