

#### SUNDAY CONNECTION

Luke 15:1-3,11-32
Jesus teaches about forgiveness in the parable of the Prodigal Son.

The parable Jesus tells in today's Gospel is unique to the Gospel of Luke. Three familiar parables—the lost sheep, the lost coin, and today's parable of the prodigal son—invite us to consider the depth of God's mercy and love.

Today's gospel speaks of the Father with two sons, the younger taking his inheritance and returning home, penniless and the older who remains on the farm and works diligently. Upon the return of the younger son, the father kills the fatten calf and celebrates the return of the younger son while the older son is indignant of the treatment the younger son receives. The dad is overjoyed at the younger son's return and is confused at the reaction of the older son. The father is filled with gratitude upon his son's return and love for the older son who remained faithful. The older son's jealously diminishes his understanding of his Father's love for both his sons.

Jesus reaches out to sinners while they are still sinners, inviting them to conversion through fellowship with him. Jesus is God acting among us; by befriending us, he is inviting us to return to friendship with God. Through friendship with Jesus, our sins are forgiven and we, in turn, bear fruit for God. Recall last Sunday's Gospel and the barren fig tree.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Today's Gospel describes the reason for our joy: God's great love for us has been revealed in Jesus. Through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and one another.

# March 30, 2025

Jeremiah declares that the Lord knew him before he was born, and dedicated and appointed him to his role as prophet even before he drew his breath. We, too, are known and sent by the Lord. What deeds of love and service are mine to perform.

## The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Reconciliation is a sacrament where Catholics confess their sins to a priest, express sorrow for them, and receive absolution (forgiveness) in the name of God.

Importance: It's seen as a way to heal broken relationships with God and the Church, and to continue the work of conversion and forgiveness that began at Baptism.

#### **Process:**

**Examination of Conscience:** Before seeking reconciliation, Catholics are encouraged to reflect on their sins and actions.

**Confession:** The penitent confesses their sins to the priest.

**Act of Contrition:** The penitent expresses sorrow for their sins and resolves to avoid them in the future.

**Penance:** The priest assigns a penance (a prayer or action) to be performed as a sign of repentance.

**Absolution:** The priest pronounces the words of absolution, forgiving the sins in the name of God.

**Benefits:** Reconciliation offers forgiveness, peace of conscience, and a renewed sense of hope and grace.

**Frequency:** The Catholic Church encourages regular participation in the sacrament, with the precept to confess serious sins at least once a year.
