The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – A (5-31-26)3

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast originated early in the Church’s history as a reaction to heresies like Arianism which denied the dogma of the Holy Trinity. It is celebrated throughout the Catholic Church to commemorate how the mystery of the Holy Trinity reveals the relationship which endures within God. Our readings today echo this revelation and teach us the importance of such affiliations with God and with each other

Today’s reading from Exodus tells the story of how the tablets of the law were renewed after the great rebellion of the Israelites on Sinai. When Moses went up the mountain to receive God’s laws, the people got tired of waiting and made themselves a new god to worship. When Moses returned the Israelites were worshipping a golden calf. In anger, Moses smashed the tablets of the law on the base of the mountain. The people immediately repented and begged for forgiveness. Moses was then summoned by God to travel back up the mountain so that the tablets, as well as the covenant, could be renewed. As Moses approaches, God moves towards Moses and pronounced His divine name and through intimacy and vulnerability, shows His willingness to take another chance with this stiff-necked people. In reaction to this kindness and bountiful mercy, the prophet begs God to continue to travel with the people of Israel. Within our own lives, God perpetually invites us to a more intimate relationship. Just as God renews the covenant with the Israelites in this passage, He calls us closer, to renew our relationship and be healed from the damage we have done to ourselves.

In the second reading from the Paul’s second letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle, urges his audience to live a life of love in obedience to the commandment of Christ. Paul explains that if we mend our ways and make efforts to cooperate with each other, God will abide among us and we will live in peace. This peace is significant. When the resurrected Christ first appeared to his apostles, His first words to them were “Peace be with you.” When we share with one another the Kiss of Peace at Mass, we are ritually acknowledging the presence of Christ among us. This is the holy kiss to which Paul refers in this passage. In the Trinity, God is revealed as relationship, and, correspondingly, it is through relationship that God dwells among us.

The benefit of drawing close to God is explained in today’s passage from the Gospel of John. This passage deserves a closer look: “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.” It is important to remember that through original sin we have been separated from our creator. Our Father does not want this temporary life to be our end. Therefore, to redeem us, God make Himself vulnerable through Jesus, the second person of the Trinity. Finally, the Holy Spirit helps us recognize that through actively seeking a relationship with Jesus that we will be saved.

God is revealed to us as relationship in the person of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and dwells among us through our relationships with one another.

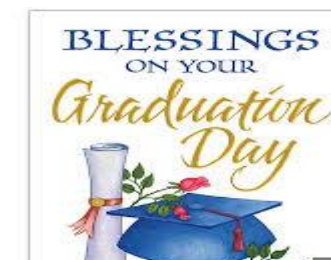

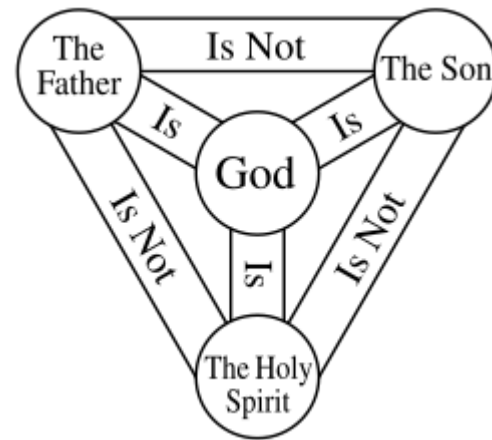
