A Reflection on 1 Cor 1:3-9 and Mark 13:33-37

MY NEW YEAR WISH FOR YOU

January 1st is more than a month away but the real and important new year begins today. Rather than simply say this is a new liturgical year, let's see it as the start of our new year of personal, spiritual and moral growth. This will be completely different, more challenging and rewarding than January 1, 2021 will be. How so? Because today Jesus gives us a fresh start. He gives us countless opportunities throughout this new year to truly listen to his words, to imitate his mercy, compassion, love and good works, to grow and abide in him, to come to the threshold of death and rise to new life.

On this First Sunday of Advent the gospel is not taken from ancient prophecies foretelling the coming of the Messiah, nor from one of the nativity narratives. Today's gospel comes immediately before the recounting of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. The message is loud, clear, challenging and appropriate for our first day of our new year of spiritual growth: "Be watchful! Be alert! Watch!"

To watch for Jesus is to be vigilant and ready. This new year let's give the Lord our undivided attention so he can guide us to a better life. In the first reading, St. Paul encourages us to use the spiritual gift we have already received thanks to his First Coming. In today's parable Jesus says that each person "has [their] own work" to do in the master's household. This new year let's be watchful by constantly striving to do God's will in our lives. We can all start by avoiding sin and partaking of the sacrament of reconciliation. By deepening our relationship with Jesus and imitating him by using our God given talents for the service and welfare of others. Let's grow as a both a faith 'ohana and personal family by building each other up, by making church and home a place of joy, understanding, forgiveness. and support. Let's be diligent and always ready to acknowledge Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives. We can be alert by seeing and acknowledging, thanking and praising God for the many blessings showered upon us. We can be vigilant through the hard times and challenges by leaning on Jesus for support. We can be watchful and alert by opening our hearts when someone is hungry for kindness, thirsty for forgiveness, in need of being clothed in understanding, and when someone needs to be visited in their isolation or sadness.

Throughout this new year of personal, spiritual and moral opportunity let's always be watchful and alert to how God comes into our normal daily lives and leads us into the kingdom that is already present and is to come, and be diligent in doing our part.

BISHOP LARRY'S DISPENSATION UPDATE

"Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through December 31, 2020. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can. It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives."
