



Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – Lectionary C (11-09-25)

This Sunday we celebrate the dedication of the Archbasilica of Saints John Lateran in Rome. It was dedicated to both Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Apostle. This church is the Cathedral of the city of Rome. While not as large or impressive as Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, it is considered the most important church in Rome. This celebration allows us an opportunity to reflect on the concept of a "mother church." Is it the oldest church in our area? Is it the largest sanctuary in the area? Or is it the place where we were baptized, raised, and where our families worshipped? This feast inspires us to reflect on what makes a place of worship important. Our scriptures today help us to form our own answers to this question.

In our reading from the Book of Ezekiel, the prophet describes his vision concerning the Temple in Jerusalem. At that time, this Temple was considered the center of Jewish worship. In his vision he depicts water flowing from the Temple to the East and to the South, giving life to the surrounding area. This passage presents a vision of the Temple as a vehicle God uses to provide life for His people. We can understand that the worship of God gives us life spiritually and can appreciate the place where we worship as a source of that life. This is why we take care of maintaining our churches.

In today's passage from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle explains that we, the people, are the Church. We are the foundation of God's plan. We are a community of believers, filled with the Holy Spirit, sent out to spread the Gospel throughout the world. Each one of us must take care that we build upon the foundation of our bond to Christ Jesus to ensure our cooperation with God's plan. For Paul, we are the temple of God from which Christ nourishes the world. Those who try to oppose our efforts will fail because, ultimately, God is on our side.

Our passage from the Gospel of John tells the story of Jesus cleansing the Temple. Jesus makes a whip and drives the money changers from the Temple. His outrage is explained by a quote from Psalm 69:" Zeal for your house will consume me." Jesus is not only angry about how this desecrates God's Temple, but He is also enraged at how worshippers are exploited. When Jesus is challenged to prove His authority for such actions, He says "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Jesus sees his Body as a temple and alludes to His passion and resurrection. Clearly for Jesus the Temple is holy not only because it is a building dedicated to God but that it houses the people who filled with God's love and Spirit as they worship.

The feast celebrated on our Sunday liturgy asks us to consider what makes our churches holy. It can be the beauty of place, it can be the history that surrounds it, or perhaps it can be the people who gather there. The scriptures reveal that it is all of the above. Our answer affirms what we find most inspirational and provides us with more to appreciate.


