

LIVING the WORD

A Reflection on Ezekiel 18:25-28, Philippians 2:1-13, Matthew 21:28-32

A Simple Choice: Change and Live

The most difficult challenge we personally face is change. To change ourselves, our mind, attitude, our way of thinking, behavior, our habits, focus, way of living essentially one's very being, is no easy task. That's why we always ask ourselves what's to gain and what's in it for me to change? To avoid change we often convince ourselves this is who I am, like it or leave it. Simply said, we are often afraid that change will cost us but everything in life costs something. Whether we change or not, can cost more than we ever realized. The prophet Ezekiel knows this, that's why he echoes what's in his peoples' hearts and minds when they find it easier to blame God rather than themselves for their sorrowful fate. He tells them that if they turn away from their sin, if they change, they can live. Change is conversion. To sin is to miss the mark, the target. What's the target? To be the daughter or son of God and to be perfect as God is perfect. Not an easy task for us mortals yet, that is the very task set before us each day of our lives. If we are missing the target then we are not aligned with it, so, we have to change our position, better focus our heart, mind and soul so the target is completely in focus. We have to change. In the gospel, Jesus speaks of two siblings asked to do their father's biding. One says yes, but does not do it, the other refuses, but on reflection knows it is best to change his attitude and actions and do what is asked by the father. Both siblings change, both face that moment of choice, only they are responsible for the final result of their action. Change, conversion, to be better today than we were yesterday is never easy, that's why Paul in his letter to the Philippians tells us to have "the same attitude that is in Christ Jesus." If we are humble and obedient, if we find solace in love and are open to the Spirit, if we put others first and find joy - we can change and live.
