



# LIVING THE WORD

#### THE WONDER OF MYSTERY and BEING A VERB

Ex 34:4b-6,8-9 2 Cor 13:11-13 Jn 3:16-18

Today we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity. When we say mystery we are not speaking about a puzzle or riddle that needs to be solved. The word mystery comes from the Latin mysterium, meaning something inexplicable. Rudolf Otto, the German theologian and philosopher, wrote that we can experience mysterium – mystery or the holy, as something awe inspiring, majestic, and also as something unique and fascinating. Perhaps the greatest mystery is that God is not a noun, but a verb. God is love, and all of God's actions and motivations are grounded in love – and love is a verb.

In the first reading, we find Moses in the presence of God who proclaims he is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. God says this after the Israelites have worshiped a golden calf. In the face of their apostasy and betrayal, Moses sees the depth of God's love and mercy. God then proceeds to make a covenant with Moses and his people. When Moses descends the mountain his face is radiant from being in the presence of God and experiencing the daunting, majestic and awe inspiring mysterium itself – God as an active verb.

Our gospel, a mere three sentences, is the shortest of all the year. It is also the most glorious, wonder, and action filled gospel for it declares that "God so loved the world that he gave his own Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life." God gives his Son as gift to the world through the incarnation. The Son loves the Father and the world and brings us to redemption through his sacrifice. The Spirit is given to us from the Father and the Son so we can more fully share in their life which calls us to become verbs ourselves.

In the second reading, Paul prays that the grace of the Lord Jesus, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of us. That fellowship with the Holy Trinity brings us to fellowship with each other as we rejoice, mend our ways, encourage one another, live in peace and greet each other with a holy kiss. Living in the Holy Trinity we are called to holy action. Living in the inexplicable mystery we are transformed into the verbs of God so we can become dynamic, giving, sharing, inspiring and unique individuals like the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Live the mystery of the Holy Trinity by becoming a verb.

# + JUNE 7, 2020 \* THE MOST HOLY TRINITY + "What is Trinity Sunday?"



Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor the Holy Trinity—the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Although the word "trinity" does not appear in Scripture, it is taught in Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Corinthians 13:14 and many other biblical passages. The concept of the Trinity can never be completely understood or rationalized, but it is clearly taught in Scripture. Understanding of all scriptural doctrine is by faith which comes through the work of the Holy Spirit; therefore, it is appropriate that this mystery is celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost, when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit first occurred.

On Trinity Sunday, the Christian Church ponders with joy and thanksgiving what the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have done to accomplish the salvation of sinful humanity. It is brought to remembrance how Christians should respond to the love God has shown us, praising Him and giving Him glory. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter. Scriptural readings for the Trinity Sunday ceremony may include Psalm 8, beginning and ending with, "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth." 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 appeals to believers to aim for perfection and live in peace, ending with the prayer that the grace of Christ Jesus, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all, including again the commission Jesus left for believers in Matthew 28:16-20. Today, Trinity Sunday is to explain, to the best of man's ability, the clues written in Scripture to guide us to a fuller understanding of our triune God. The Father is God from the beginning (John 1:1): Jesus revealed Himself as equal to the Father in John 10:30, "I and the Father are one." Together, they sent the Holy Spirit (John 14:26). "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

# **RE-OPENING OF THE CHURCH**

This Sunday, June 7th, is the first re-opening of Mass. Please know your Mass schedule. If your name is not on the list, you will not be able to attend Mass.

If you have NOT reserved a Mass schedule, please visit our website at <a href="https://www.pahoasacredheart.org">www.pahoasacredheart.org</a> or email shpahoasacialmedia@gmail.com.

- 1. Please plan to arrive at church at least 20 minutes prior to the beginning of Mass.
- 2. No one will be seated later than 10 minutes after Mass begins.
- 3. Please park in every other stall in the parking lot to maintain 6 ft. social distancing unless you are from the same household. No gathering of groups in the parking lot before or after Mass. If you arrive early, please stay in your vehicle. Due to the sanitization process we will only seat people 20 minutes before Mass time.
- 4. YOU MUST WEAR YOUR MASK UPON LEAVING YOUR VEHICLE. If you cannot wear a mask for the duration of the Mass you should NOT ATTEND. A mask must be worn and social distancing practices adhered to from the time you leave your car till the time you return to your car after Mass.
- 5. Just like in places of business, please follow social distancing while waiting in line to enter the portico. Distances will be marked on the walkways, the portico and church floors with ushers there to help direct you.
- 6. An usher will be present on each side of the portico, the middle entry to the portico will be closed off. The usher will ask for your name. Your name MUST be on the reservation list for the Mass that you are attending. If you are NOT on the list, you will NOT be seated.
- 7. People will be seated starting at the front of the church working out onto the portico. Due to social distancing requirements we are unable to seat you in any specific pew.
- 8. Before entering the portico, your temperature will be taken. **If your temperature is above 100.4 F you will not be able to attend Mass**. Please expect to be asked the following questions: Do you now have, or have you recently had a fever? Do you have or have recently had a cough, runny nose, sore throat, or other symptoms? Have you been in contact with an infected person? Have you traveled or flown over the ocean in the past fourteen days?

If you answer yes to any of the above, you will not be allowed to enter.

- 9. Upon entering the portico, an usher will spray your hands with hand sanitizer. If you feel uncomfortable having your hands sanitized, you will not be able to attend Mass
- 10. Whether on the portico or inside of the church, an usher will escort you to your seat. Once seated, you are required to stay in your seat until Mass begins. If you need to leave your seat, please ask an usher to conduct you.
- 11. Restrooms will be locked at all times but an usher will be available to open them when necessary. Restrooms will be disinfected after every use.
- 12. **Families with babies, and/or small children:** We encourage you to stay home and attend a Mass through live-streaming. However, if you must attend, parents are required to ensure their children do not leave their seats. If you need to leave your seat, please gesture for an usher to escort you out. Children two years old and younger should not wear a mask. Children two years old and younger may put themselves at risk through not understanding the requirements of social distancing, and we ask you to consider having them taken care of at home.
- 13. Hymnals, missalettes and other worship material will not be available in the church for the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic. Parishioners are free to bring their own missals with them or to use one of the many daily Mass reading apps on their phones.
- 14. **The Collection**: We will not be passing the collection basket. Please use the drop box at the two entrances. Please consider using Online Giving or mailing a check. Do not send cash through the mail. Your continuous expression of generous Stewardship during these hard times is greatly appreciated.
- 15. The Lord's Prayer and the Sign of Peace: There is to be NO physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or the Sign of Peace. A bow, a smile, or a wave will serve as a true sign of peace to one's neighbor.
- 16. Holy Communion: Remain in your seat. Fr. John or an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion will come to give you Holy Communion.
- 17. **End of Mass and the Dismissal**: Everyone must leave the church and portico after the final blessing and dismissal to allow time for the church to be sanitized before the next Mass.

If you are seated on the portico, you must remain in your seat until directed by an usher. People on the portico will exit first and in an orderly fashion so as to maintain the required 6-foot social distance.

For those who are seated inside the church, remain in your seat until an usher directs you to the exit. The reason for this is that the portico must be cleared first. Please maintain the required 6-foot social distance while exiting.

Please note, everyone will be exiting on the side steps.

- 18. Bulletins will not be distributed after Mass but are available on the parish website <a href="https://pahoasacredheart.org/">https://pahoasacredheart.org/</a>
- 19. There is to be no gathering on the portico or church grounds before and after Mass.
- 20. Please note that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available by appointment only. Please call Fr. John at 808.965.8202.



NOVENA to the MOST SACRED HEART of JESUS

#### **REFLECTION on the SACRED HEART of JESUS**

There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

Jesus Christ is the incarnation of God's infinite love. The Human Nature which the Son of God took upon Himself was filled with love and kindness that has never found an equal. He is the perfect model of love of God and neighbor.

Every day of His life was filled with repeated proofs of "Christ's love that surpasses all knowledge" (Eph 3:19). Jesus handed down for all time the fundamental feature of His character: "Take My yoke upon your shoulders and learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of Heart" (Mt 11:29). He invited all, refusing none, surprising friends and rivals by His unconditional generosity.

The meaning of love in the life of Jesus was especially evident in His sufferings. Out of love for His Father He willed to undergo the death of the Cross. "The world must know that I love the Father and do just as the Father has commanded Me" (Jn 14:31).

The love that Jesus bore toward us also urged Him to undergo the death of the Cross. At the Last Supper, He said, "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13)

The Heart of Jesus never ceases to love us in heaven. He sanctifies us through the Sacraments. These are inexhaustible fountains of grace and holiness which have their source in the boundless ocean of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
