LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Lev 19:1-2, 17-18 Ps 103:1-4, 8, 10, 12-13 1 Cor 3:16-23 Mt 5:38-48

Today, Jesus delivers very challenging teachings when he tells us to “offer no resistance to one who is evil...turn the other cheek...give your tunic and hand over your cloak as well...love your enemies...pray for those who persecute you...” What sounds even more impossible is the opening sentence of the first reading from Leviticus and the last sentence from today’s gospel. Both tell us “Be holy, as God is holy; be perfect, as your Father is perfect.” Who can act and love like this? Who can be this holy and perfect? Now’s a good time to recall another teaching of Jesus: “Nothing is impossible for God.”

In the second reading Paul reminds us that we are holy because the Spirit of God already dwells within us. The Greek word Matthew uses for perfect means to become whole, complete, fulfilled. The Holy Spirit enable us to become holy and perfect but it is a gradual process of conversion, of constantly striving to do the right thing, acting justly, being faithful, kind, considerate, understanding, empathetic, encouraging one another, going the extra mile. This is how the Spirit brings us to holiness, completion, fulfillment and perfection.

Take a few moments of silent prayer to reflect upon how, through God’s power and grace, you can become truly holy and perfect.

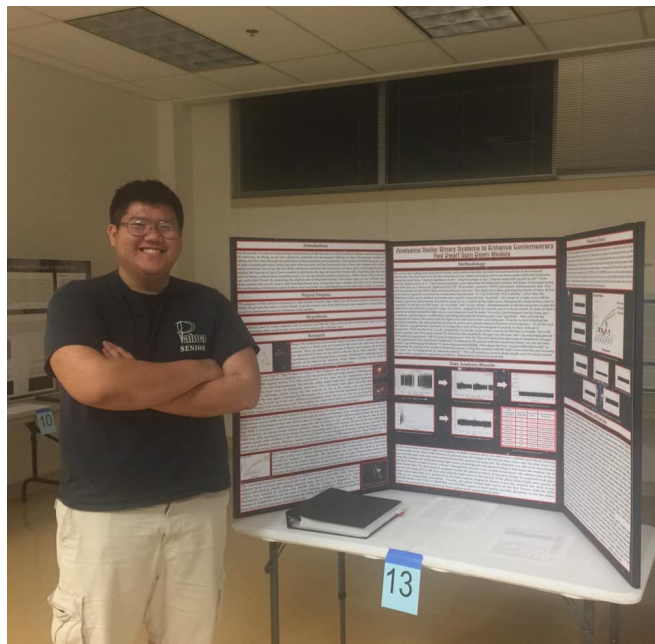

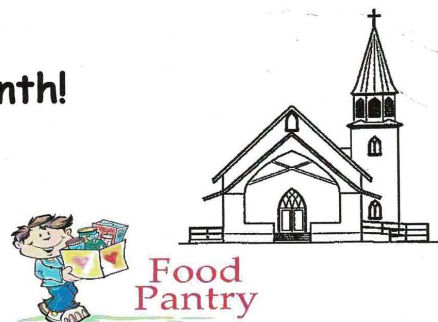
If you buy 1 canned good, joyfully buy another for the poor.

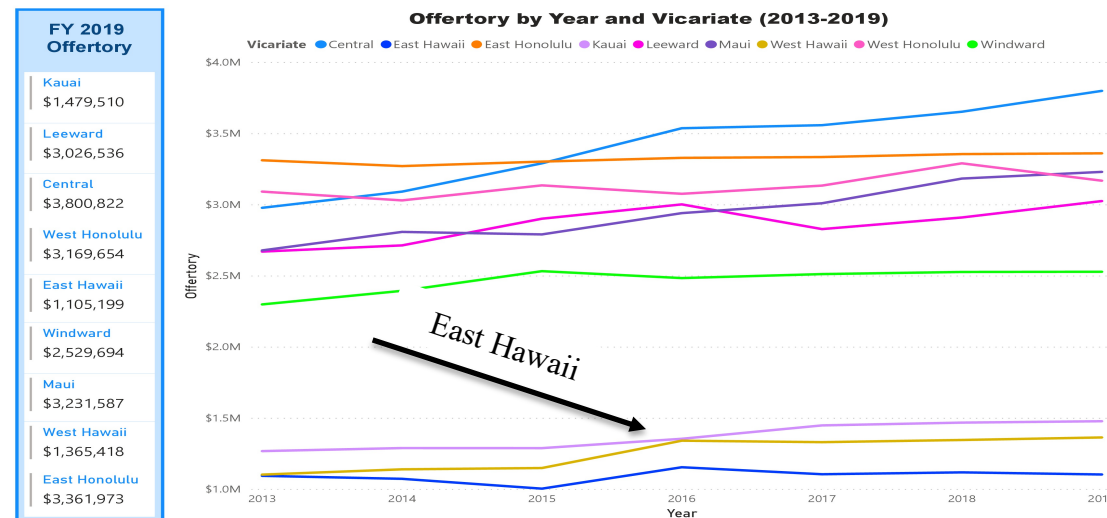
