LIVING THE WORD
A Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Luke 2:22-40

This Sunday's gospel from Luke speaks to us about fulfillment and challenge. Mary and Joseph have both fulfilled God's will to become man and wife and to raise the infant Jesus. Today they take Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to fulfill the ritual law of offering their first born to God and to give thanks. While there they encounter Simeon and Anna. This is not some chance meeting, this encounter is directed by the Holy Spirit. Both Simeon and Anna have a very deep faith than can best be characterized as one of waiting - waiting for God's promise to be finally fulfilled. And that day in the holy Temple, God's very house, they see it fulfilled in Jesus. The challenge is that now faith must change from one of waiting to a faith of following.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and ask yourself are you still waiting in the dark or are you walking in the light following in the footsteps of Jesus?
