LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Isa 58:7-10 Ps 112:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 1 Cor 2:1-5 Mt 5:13-16

In today's gospel Jesus speaks to us of salt and light. Neither salt nor light exist for their own end, rather they both have an indispensable purpose. Salt enhances the quality of other things, it intensify flavor so bland things can become delightful. Light dissipates darkness, it has a transforming power that allows life to flourish. Jesus commands us to let our light shine. The first reading tells us how to do this: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, remove oppression. The psalm tells us that a person who acts graciously, mercifully and justly is behaving exactly as God behaves. Such behavior shines in the darkness of the world for all to see.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and reflect on how, as a follower of Jesus, you light up the dark corners of daily life for others.

FOOD PANTRY REPORT

January 2020 started off quietly. We served a total of 387, people to include children, adults and kupunas. Majority of our supplies are now being delivered by The Food Basket, costing us a minimal amount.

We are supplied with what they get in, so each month varies between poultry, meats and dairy. We are supplied also with canned fruits and vegetables and an assortment of dried fruits and other edibles. We are in need of meats and a continuous supply of rice and noodles, whether it be saimen or pasta.

We thank all of the supporters of this very important ministry, whether with donations of food, tending the emergency pantry, setting up and filling keiki backpacks, setting up for food pantry day and doing the distribution on the 3rd Thursday's of each month. All of these tasks are part of the ministry and your sacrifice of time and talent and treasure is appreciated.

Repair work done in 2019:

1. Repaired the posts that hold up the walkway roof by the office door.
2. Treated and exterminated the termites in the window frames on the sides of the church.
3. Replaced most of the motion detector lights around the church. We are still working on the last few.
4. Work in progress in repairing the lights on the front of the portico.
5. March 15th: Bell Tower octagon rehab complete. Work began June 2018
6. March 28th: New solid wood core, flush, exterior door installed @ Avery Hall Youth Classroom.
7. May 9th: Second of (2) refurbished tilt, stained glass windows installed at choir loft.
8. May 10th. Chain link fence installed around Rectory
9. June 21st: (2) oscillating wall fans installed under choir loft. (1) at each side wall.
10. July 6th: Install light box @ stained glass window @ choir loft.
11. September 1st. Install new PVC clad wd /glass door @ screened room behind bathrooms.
12. November 26th: Installed new platform in front of Altar.
13. In December, the flashing on the Bell Tower was repaired so that water was not running down the wall onto the electrical meters, etc.

Repair work done in 2020:

On Jan. 29th, we finished replacing the fascia board on the front of the portico, and added flashing.

Work that is scheduled for the near future:

Repair work on the damaged Bell Tower siding will start in early Feb.

1. Put the telephone and cable wires from the street to the Rectory underground.
2. Repair surface of the trench in the parking lot to the Hall so it is not a trip hazard.
3. Replace the carpet leading up to the choir room in the church.
4. Repair all the rotted and termite damaged wood throughout the church property
5. Refinish the wood cap on the railing wall in the Portico.
6. Paint the interior of the church.
7. Clean the church roof.

Longer term projects:

1. Update the Avery hall kitchen
2. Clean, organize and add shelves in the storage room behind the bathrooms.
