LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent

John 4:5-42

The Samaritan women in today's gospel is obviously a person with a past. All of us have a past, a history, a difficult time in our life, a sin we might rather keep hidden from others. This can often be a heavy burden.

Jesus is at the well because he is physically thirsty, but he sees and knows that the Samaritan woman is more thirsty than he is, and it is not for well water that she thirsts, but to be accepted, to be forgiven, to be truly loved. Jesus does not wait for her to tell him about her hidden life – he reveals it to her. He reveals, but does not judge, because Jesus is more interested in her future than in her past. Jesus knows only he can quench her thirst. Only Jesus can quench *our* thirst to be accepted, forgiven, and loved.

If we keep going to the well of our sin to drink, we will go through life parched, but if we accept Jesus' invitation to drink living water – the water of new life and possibility – then we too, like the Samaritan woman, can leave our old water jug behind and move forward towards eternal life.

Take Time for prayer and ask Jesus to quench your thirst.

HOMEMADE MULTI-PURPOSE DISINFECTANT and DEODORIZING SPRAY

Below is a recipe from www.livesimply.me on how to make my own disinfectant spray. I made it. The only strong odor you will smell is the alcohol. I added Lavender essential oil to reduce the strong smell of the alcohol.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup 100 proof alcohol (Vodka) or the highest proof alcohol you can find or rubbing alcohol or vinegar. (I could only find the 91% rubbing alcohol)
- 1 cup white distilled vinegar or more alcohol
- 50-60 drops tea tree or lavender essential oil

Instructions:

1. Pour the alcohol into a 16 ounce spray bottle. Then the essential oil(s). Shake the bottle to combine the alcohol and oils. Finally, add the vinegar and shake the bottle again. This recipe is not safe to use on special stone surfaces, like granite or marble, due to the vinegar.

Recipe Notes:

The essential oil is added as an antibacterial ingredient. Hydrogen peroxide can also work as a disinfectant when used straight (not diluted). Just be careful with hydrogen peroxide as it can bleach colored fabrics.
