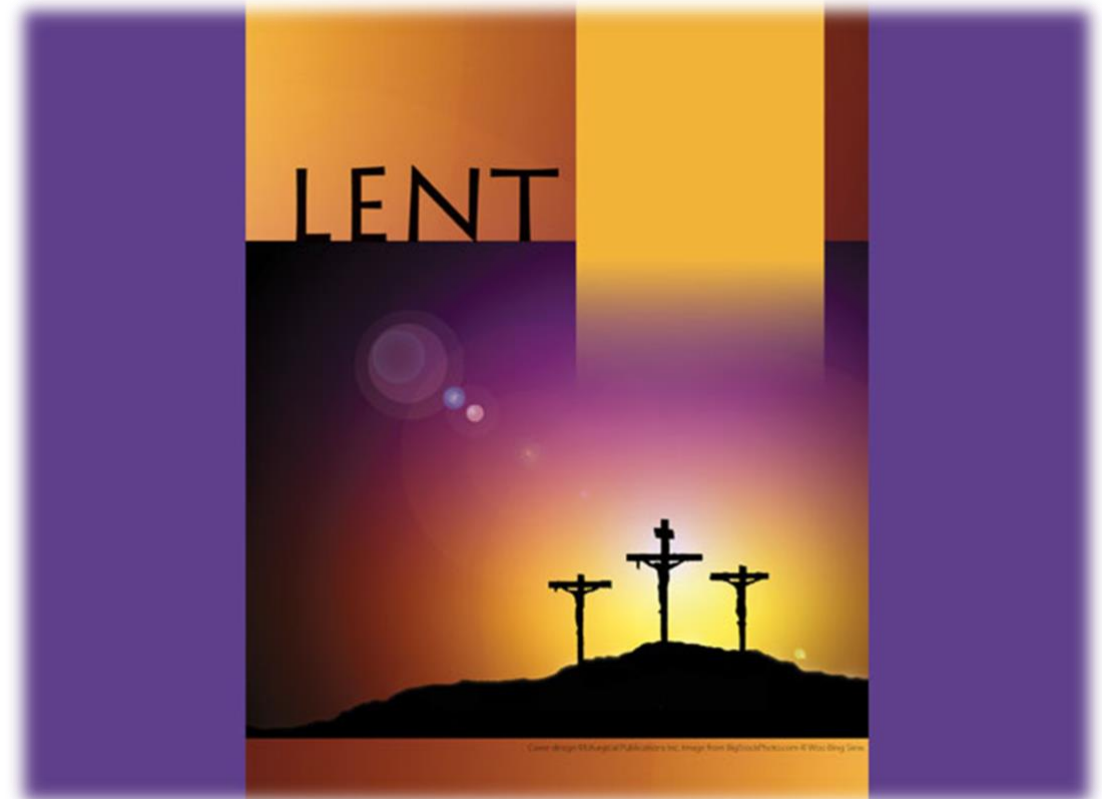

LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Gn 2:7-9,3:1-7 Ps 51:3-4,5-6,12-13,17 Rom 5:12-19 Mt 4:1-11

After Jesus' baptism where God proclaims him to be his beloved Son, the Spirit immediately leads him to the desert to be tempted. Satan's goal is to sabotage Jesus' mission. The three temptations are meant to derail Jesus from carrying out God's plan to be the light of the world and to bring salvation to all. Jesus rebuffs each temptation by quoting Scripture that reinforces God's covenantal plan. Refusing to go the way of the tempter Jesus is fully and freely embracing the will of the Father and the way of the cross.

Everyday, we too face many temptations that can derail us from our own God given vocation and mission in life. The first and second reading makes it clear that it is easy for us to be like Adam who did not resist temptation, in fact we frequently are - but how unfailingly does God's grace and Spirit call us to be like Jesus.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and reflect on whom do you look to resist temptation and learn obedience to God - to Adam or to Christ?

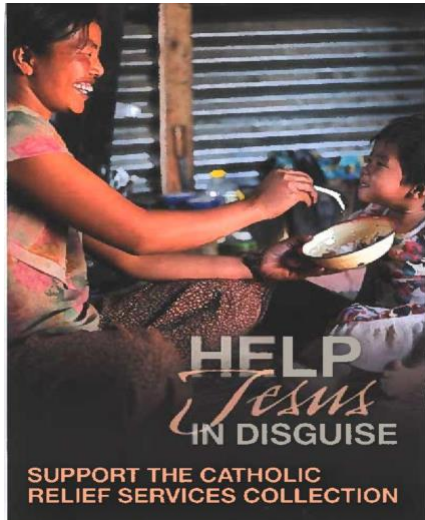

Pope Francis has come down with a “slight disposition” according to the Vatican spokesman.

On Ash Wednesday, Pope Francis was seen coughing and blowing his nose during Ash Wednesday Mass. The Vatican has not specified the nature of the Pope’s illness.

In Rome, the total number of the confirmed cases of the coronavirus is 400. During the general audience in St. Peter’s Square on Ash Wednesday, Pope Francis expressed his support for coronavirus sufferers. ***“I wish, again, to express my closeness to those who are ill with coronavirus and to health care workers who are caring for them,”*** he said, according to the Vatican News.
