



BISHOP LARRY'S DISPENSATION UPDATE

"Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through December 31, 2020. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can. It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives."

A Reflection on Mark 1:1-8 and Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11

Four Joyful Annunciations To (YOUR NAME HERE).

Have you been awake, watchful and vigilant? Good, because today's gospel tells us why we need to be so: Jesus is on his way.

The opening line of Mark's gospel is bold, brave, and challenging: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." Okay, maybe today it doesn't sound so extraordinary but it truly is. By using "the beginning" Mark refers to the first line from Genesis; he wants us to know that God is doing something new and life giving right now. The Greek word *evangelion*, is today translated simply as gospel or good news, but it is so much more. *Evangelion* means great, stupendous news, worthy of public acclamation, it's stand up and shout kind of news. And what is this great resounding news? That Jesus is the Christ – the long awaited Messiah. Jesus' name means "God saves" and so he does and forever will. Not only is he the Messiah, Mark reveals he is also the only Son of God. In this simple but profound sentence we learn that Jesus is coming to save his people, that he is the fulfillment of all the hopes of Israel, that God's covenantal promises are coming to fruition, not just in the past, but now, in our hearing, in our lives. Is that "good news" or what?

Are you still awake, watchful and vigilant? Good, because there is more. John the Baptist suddenly appears in the desert. Why the desert? Because that's part of the journey for all the people of God, then, now, and to come. It's our place of trail, temptation and woes. It is also the place of God's revelation, love, and covenant. John offers baptism for the repentance and forgiveness of sin in the Jordan River. Why this river? Because God's people had to cross it to reach the promised land, and we still do through our own baptism. Why repentance? Because repentance is *metanoia* – the want and the willingness to change direction, to change our minds and hearts so we can cross over to that promised land – the Kingdom of God..

Is your pulse racing, are your eyes wide in anticipation? Good. There's more. John baptized with water but Jesus plunges us into the life of the Holy Spirit where each of us is fully connected to the Father, the Son, and the life and grace giving Spirit which empowers us to do and be the unimaginable – the daughters and sons of God, the brother of Jesus, the sharers in all the profound and life changing grace, courage and transforming power of the Spirit.

FOOD PANTRY

Sacred Heart Food Pantry fed 440 people in the month of November. 133 children, 161 adults, and 146 kupuna, a total of 159 families. December brings holiday challenges where not only do we do food pantry, but we a program where we aloha our kupuna and keiki with gifts. Our Giving Tree event transforms into gift giving for our parish ohana and beyond. With your generous kokua through the years, you have made this possible. Giving, this year especially with so much going on in our everyday lives, is understandably stressful. If you feel that you're in a pinch and cannot help to make a lovely Christmas for another, remember how when Elijah went to visit the widow and asked her make her bread. She told him she had only enough to make herself and her son some bread and then they will die. Elijah assured her that she and her will not die, to make the bread and her flour and oil jars would never go empty. The story goes on and tells how she and her son were able to eat for a whole year. This story tells us that we should always have faith and hope and love in hearts to share what little we have and not to be afraid of being without because in sharing, we receive in tenfold.

In light of our current situation with COVID-19 and all of the restrictions that we have to adhere to keep ourselves and our loved ones safe, we are planning to engage in a new venture to help our parish.
