Sunday Connection

John 6:24-35

Jesus teaches the crowds that he is the “bread of life

In today’s Gospel, the crowd asks Jesus for a sign so that they can believe that he has come from God. Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people with just five barley loaves and two fish. How quickly they seem to have forgotten the wonderful thing that Jesus has done for them. Or, maybe they never recognized the miracle in the first place. They show this in their interpretation of the sign that came from Moses. In their description, they identify Jesus with Moses, as if to say, as Moses gave the people manna in the desert, give us a sign so that we will know that you are from God. They are looking to identify a prophet without realizing that God is standing before them. Jesus corrects their misinterpretation, saying that the manna received by their ancestors came from God. As God fulfilled their ancestors’ needs in the desert, so God has provided them with food for eternal life. In the bread that they have received from Jesus, they have received physical nourishment and also spiritual nourishment. Jesus wants the crowd to see beyond the surface to the One who provides true nourishment.

Sometimes we don’t recognize the wonderful things that God has done for us. Sometimes, we simply forget and ask for further evidence of his love and care. We pray that God will remove our blindness so that we can receive with thanks and praise all the wonderful things that God accomplishes in our lives. Name the wonderful gifts that God has given you and some of the remarkable deeds that God has accomplished in our lives. Observe that it is important to stop to count our blessings because we can easily miss recognizing all of the wonderful things that God does for us. *Article taken from: 08/03/2021, 18th Sunday in Ordinary*



July Food Pantry

Thank you to the many hands that make this ministry possible. Thank you to the generous parishioners who donate food and contribute to help feed the people of Pahoia.

We are always in need of large brown paper bags and any food donations you can share. Our pantry need protein of any sort, canned vegetables and breakfast foods. If you have extra toiletries like soaps, toothpaste, women hygiene products, shampoo, and deodorants, there is a great need for these items.

In the month of July, Sacred Heart Parish served 86 families, of which 52 were children, 91 adults and 67 kupuna.

At the Kalapana site, 72 families were given food, of which 18 were children, 60 adults, and 39 kupuna.

Our next Sacred Heart Food Pantry date is August 19, 2021 at which time children and kupuna Christmas gifts signup will begin. It is required to have a total number of participants by October, in order to have gifts for Christmas. Please consider who you can enlist for Christmas gifts.


