LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Gospel

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 Colossians 3:12-21 Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

So much has happened in one week. We moved from the bright anticipation of Advent to the joyful celebration of Christmas, but now suddenly we hear of dark days ahead for the Holy Family.

In today's gospel the angel urgently warns Joseph that Jesus' life is in dire danger. We soon find this sad little trio on the sorrowful road of seeking refuge in Egypt. For the foreseeable future Joseph, Mary and Jesus will face fear, uncertainty and unease. So how did these three become a holy family?

Joseph acts without hesitation to protect Jesus and Mary for he is fully committed to his family and to God. God came to us as a dependent child, and like the first reading suggests Jesus learned to honor, respect and obey his parents. Together, the three are individuals and throughout their years together they learned the give and take of daily family life. In the second reading Paul tells the Colossians to be compassionate, kind, humble, gentle, patient, and forgiving - something that all families have to learn and put into practice.

Today's gospel story shows us that holiness is a realistic engagement in the difficulties, struggles, and the daily tensions of human life and in trying to faithfully do God's will. The manner in how we respond to those challenges is how a family becomes holy.
