LIVING THE LORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Gospel

Luke 20:27-38

In today's gospel, it first appears that the Sadducees are questioning Jesus on marriage but in reality, they are questioning the resurrection. Jesus does not fall into their trap. He tells them that life on earth is different than life in heaven. He furthermore assures them that God is not the God of the dead but of the living, for even the dead are living to God. The Sadducees don't understand or accept that there is the present life and the resurrected life, where those, if found worthy, becomes "the children of God" and share God's very life. God is God of the living, there is no death in him.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and reflect on that promise of eternal life with God.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

While this very important celebration is usually on December 8, since that is a Sunday this year, all the Masses for December 7th and 8th will be for the Second Sunday of Advent. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9. Although the Paulist Press Ordo says it is not a holy day of obligation this year, since the Diocese of Honolulu only celebrates two holy days of obligation throughout the year (Immaculate Conception and Christmas), **the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception WILL be celebrated on Monday, December 9, 2019, as a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION in the Diocese of Honolulu.** Pastors are asked to schedule Masses so that all may observe this holy day of obligation and to publicize that it is a holy day of obligation well in advance of December 9th.

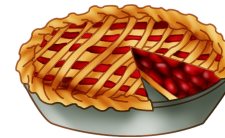

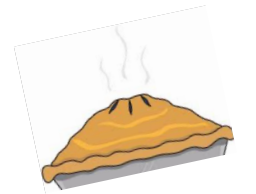
PIE CONTEST

- Third place - White ribbon

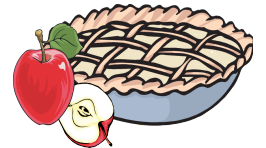


CATEGORIES:
