A Reflection on Sunday's Gospel Luke 17:11-19

Today's gospel is all about attitude and awareness. The ten lepers, aware they cannot approach Jesus, call on him from afar. Aware of his power, they call him 'master.' Aware of having no right to anything, it is with an attitude of humility that they ask Jesus for everything true mercy can give. Jesus aware of all this does not approach them, touch them nor declares them healed, but tells the ten to go and show themselves to the priests. They depart - still lepers. The healing takes place only as they are on their way, it is their attitude of faith and trust in Jesus that heals them.

The Samaritan leper, aware deep in his heart that something happened well beyond the healing of his body, returns to Jesus who says: "Your faith has saved you." All ten were cleansed on the outside, but the one who returned was also made well on the inside. All ten had healing but only the Samaritan had the awareness and attitude of being truly blessed.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and reflect on how aware are you of God's many blessings and what attitude do you have towards God's mercy and goodness.


