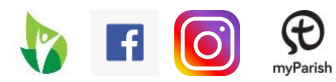

"LIVING THE WORD"

A Reflection on Sunday's Gospel

Luke 16:19-31

Today, Jesus tells us the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man dresses in fine clothes and holds sumptuous feasts. Poor Lazarus is clothed in sore and begs for scraps of food. He receives no care and goes hungry. Death comes for both. Lazarus is carried by angels to the bosom of Abraham but the rich man is sent to Hades in torment.

Luke's gospel can easily be seen as the hard news of reversals. The lowly servant is looked upon with favor, the proud are scattered, the slave is blessed, the mighty fall from their thrones, the hungry are fed while the rich are sent away empty. If the rich man had lived as a humble and grateful steward, had he shared his wealth, food and clothing with Lazarus, he would not have found himself in hell. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves.

Take a few moments of silent prayer and reflect on who are the less fortunate in your neighborhood, and do you share a portion of your own blessings with them?

CALL TO STEWARDSHIP

The sin of the rich man in today's parable was not that he was rich, but that he failed to share his wealth with the beggar at his gate. He knew Lazarus, perhaps walked by him every time he came in or out, but did nothing to relive his suffering. Is there a Lazarus in my life? What am I doing to help?

SUNDAY REFLECTION

A major theme in the Gospel of Luke is the importance of the care of the poor in the life of discipleship. In the parable found in today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man. Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. Both dies. Lazarus finds himself in heaven; the rich man in the netherworld. The rich man asks for assistance from Lazarus in his torment. But Abraham reminds the rich man of the good things he had in his life and describes the current situation as a reversal of fortunes. The rich man then asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his family, but this is denied with the reminder that Moses and the prophets have warned of judgement for those who neglect the care of the poor.

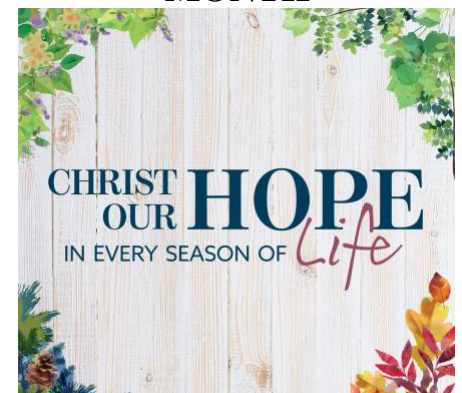
In the context of Luke's Gospel, the parable, delivered in the presence of a crowd of listeners, is part of Jesus' response to some Pharisees. These Pharisees are described in Luke's Gospel as "loving mercy." (Note: The Pharisees were followers of a sect of Judaism active before, during, and after Jesus' lifetime. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for popular Jewish piety. They put less emphasis on Temple worship and more on applying the law everyday life. Though they are often portrayed negatively in the Gospels, they shared many of Jesus' and the early Church's concerns about the law.) Jesus observed that the actions of some Pharisees betrayed misplaced priorities: they spoke one way, but acted in another. The story of the rich man and Lazarus demonstrates the importance of the care of the poor and is reminder to those who would follow Jesus of the unimportance of wealth in the eyes of God.

Everyone is invited to bring their pet(s) to church on October 6th for the annual Blessing of the Animals.

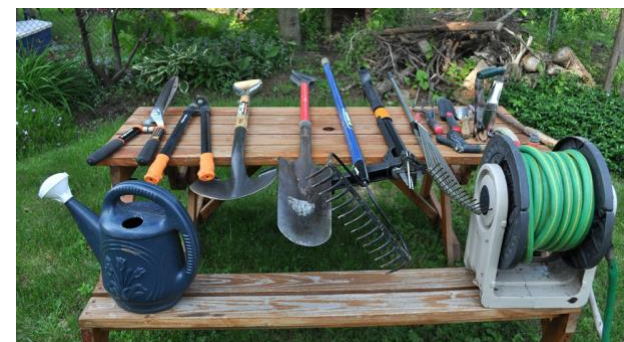
