LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17

During Advent and Christmastide Matthew's gospel made clear to us that Jesus is the son of David and of Abraham, he is Emmanuel, he is the king of the Jews, and that he is God's anointed, the Christ. This is all revealed to us before and during Jesus' birth. In today's gospel we encounter Jesus as an adult seeking baptism by John who protests this baptism. Nevertheless, Jesus imposes his authority that it must be done "to fulfill all righteousness." For Jesus, to act righteously is to act in accordance with God's will. Jesus' baptism signifies his commitment to act faithfully to his God-given mission to manifest God's saving presence to the world. God confirms Jesus' identity and commitment by sending the empowering Holy Spirit and declaring Jesus as his beloved Son.

Take a few moments of silent prayer to consider what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says: that your baptism makes you a sharer, not only in Jesus' life and death, but also in his prophetic and royal mission to bring forth the kingdom of God and to share the common priesthood of all believers.

The Mass in the Extraordinary Form – part 2

(United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)



This Apostolic Letter (Summorum Pontificum) has “the aim of:

- a. Offering to all the faithful the Roman Liturgy in the Usus Antiquior (Old Way of Celebration), considered as a precious treasure to be preserved;
- b. effectively guaranteeing and ensuring the use of the forma extraordinaria (Extraordinary Form) for all who ask for it, given that the use of the 1962 Roman Liturgy is a faculty generously granted for the good of the faithful and therefore is to be interpreted in a sense favorable to the faithful who are its principal addressees;
- c. promoting reconciliation at the heart of the Church.”



Thus did Pope Benedict XVI exhort the whole Church to “generously open our hearts and make room for everything that the faith itself allows.” Any Priest of the Latin Church—provided he has the minimum rubrical and linguistic ability—may, without any further permission from the Holy See or his Ordinary, celebrate the Extraordinary Form of the Missale Romanum in a Mass without the people at any time except during the Sacred Triduum. If members of the faithful wish to join in these celebrations, they are permitted to do so. In parishes where a stable group of the faithful are attached to the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, they may approach the pastor, who is to support their petition willingly.



A Stewardship Call to Action from Pope Francis

“Money must serve, not rule!” This is how Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, put the emphasis on one of seven major themes in his pastoral letter, *Evangelii Gaudium* (*The Joy of the Gospel*). The pontiff’s letter, formally referred to as an “apostolic exhortation,” devotes itself to the subject of the new evangelization, and shares ideas about how the church can reform itself in order to embrace a renewed sense of mission.

One of our Holy Father’s urgent concerns is how the poor of the world are being treated. In his letter he states emphatically that he loves everyone, both rich and poor, but that he is obliged in the name of Jesus Christ to remind everyone that the rich have a responsibility “... to help, respect and promote the poor” (par. 58).

Pope Francis is especially concerned about the growing global economic inequity and challenges world political and financial leaders to use our economic systems in a way that favors human beings:

Just as the commandment “Thou shalt not kill” sets a clear limit in order to safeguard the value of human life, today we also have to say “thou shalt not” to an economy of exclusion and inequality. Such an economy kills. How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure, but it is news when the stock market loses two points? (par. 52).

The pope is insistent: God calls us to make a committed response to the poor in a way that transcends the logic of the marketplace.

In his Christmas message, Pope Francis urged us to “place ourselves at the service of the poor, make ourselves small and poor with them.” He does not condemn capitalism, nor does he favor a Marxist view of economics. He is challenging each of us to follow Christ and be good stewards of his gospel message which includes loving God and neighbor, especially the poor, the prisoners, the sick, and the outcast; all whom Jesus makes reference to in his teaching on the final judgment of the nations in the Gospel of Matthew (25:31-46). It is a call to action Pope Francis urges upon us as we move into this New Year.
