LIVING THE WORD

A Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6, 1 Corinthians 1:1-3, John 1:29-34

Last week we heard Matthew's account of the meeting between John the Baptist and Jesus. This week we hear of their encounter from the gospel of John, wherein John the Baptist, reveals Jesus to be the Lamb of God, the One who forgives sins, the One who preexists, the One who is Spirit-filled, and the only Son of God. John, who baptized only with water, further reveals that Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit. Thus in our own baptism not only are we cleansed from Original Sin but we are gloriously filled with the life giving power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus calls us to be good stewards. Like Isaiah in the first reading, Paul in the second, and John in the gospel, we are each given a mission to reveal to others through our faith, life, and actions who Jesus truly is. It is through our baptism that Jesus gives us the grace and power to accomplish that mission

Take a few moments and pray for the Holy Spirit to fill your heart and to make you steadfast.

The Mass in the Extraordinary Form – part 3

The vernacular edition of the Lectionary for Mass may be used in the extraordinary form, while the 1962 calendar is to be followed. The “Ecclesia Dei” Commission will study the eventual integration of new saints and some prefaces from the ordinary form into the extraordinary Missal.

In 2011, the “Ecclesia Dei” Commission promulgated the Instruction “Universae Ecclesiae”, which further specified the use and regulation of the Extraordinary Form. This Instruction deals with the competence of Diocesan Bishops; the meaning of a “stable group of the faithful”; the qualifications of the priest-celebrant; some matters of liturgical and ecclesiastical discipline; the use of the other sacraments, including Confirmation and Holy Orders; the use of the “Breviarium Romanum”; the Sacred Triduum; the rites of religious orders; and the use of the “Pontificale Romanum” and the “Rituale Romanum”.

It is not certain what the future holds, but for the present the Church hopes that the two forms of the one Roman Rite may provide a mutual spiritual enrichment for the faithful and promote the Communion of the whole Church as an expression of unity in diversity.

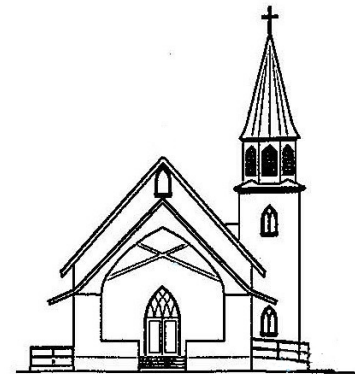

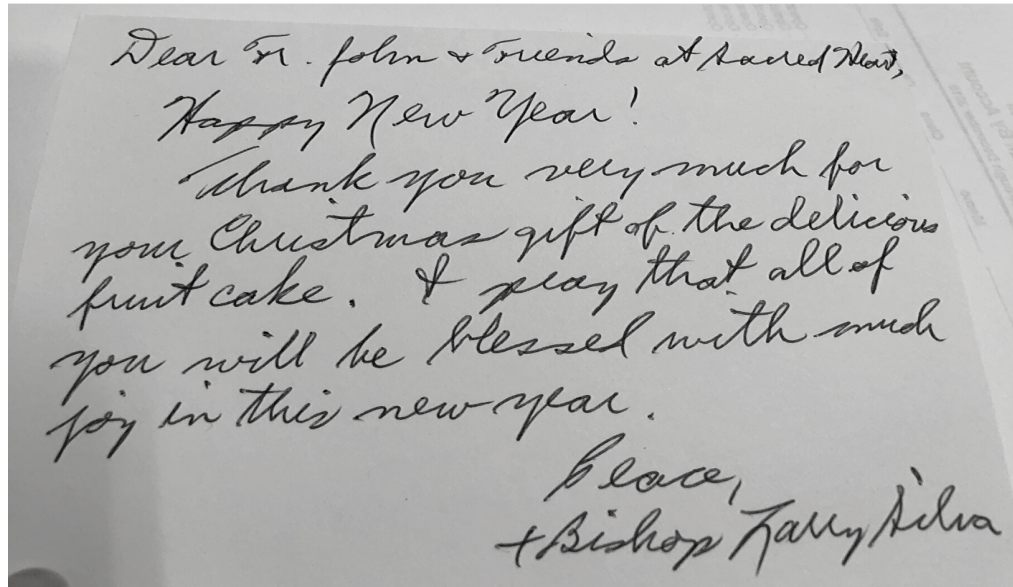

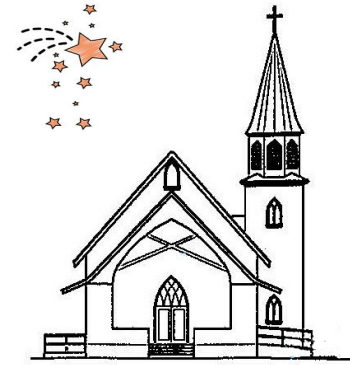
