

LIVING the WORD

A Reflection on Matthew 5:1-12a

Get Yourself An Attitude

Celebrating the feast of All Saints has three purposes: first, to venerate all the canonized saints and martyrs; second, to recognize the great multitudes of unknown women, men, youth and children who throughout the centuries have lived holy, humble, heroic, faithful, and sacrificial lives; and thirdly, that we may aspire and work to become saints ourselves.

What do all the Old and New Testament saints, the 2,000 years of canonized and unknown saints, and even the future saints have in common? Their lives were and will be shaped by the paradoxical promises of God; they follow in the footsteps of Jesus; and they all strive to cultivate an attitude of be-attitude that belongs solely and uniquely to God's topsy-turvy world view. The world admires the rich; Jesus raises up the poor. The world says seek happiness at all cost; Jesus tells us to find happiness in grieving. The world values power over others; Jesus praises the meek. The world encourages self-fulfillment; Jesus tells us to work for justice. The world says only the ruthless succeed; Jesus proclaims the merciful blessed. The world urges everyone to go for the gold; Jesus says to keep our hearts pure. The world honors the winners of wars, strife, and conflicts; Jesus raises up the peacemakers. The world sees the poor, the persecuted, and the afflicted as losers; Jesus crowns them victors.

How can we become saints? We can start by having the right internal disposition, an attitude about how we want to live our life, an attitude about our relationship with God and with our neighbor, an attitude about what gives true meaning and value to our lives. Because of our baptism, confirmation, and our sharing in the Holy Eucharist, God truly expects and wants us to be saints. God knows we are sinners, but every single saint was a sinner who never gave up. You can start to become a saint today by simply getting an attitude - the attitude of Christ.

New Pandemic Restrictions Regarding Funerals

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

BISHOP LARRY'S DISPENSATION UPDATE

"Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through December 31, 2020. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can. It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives."
