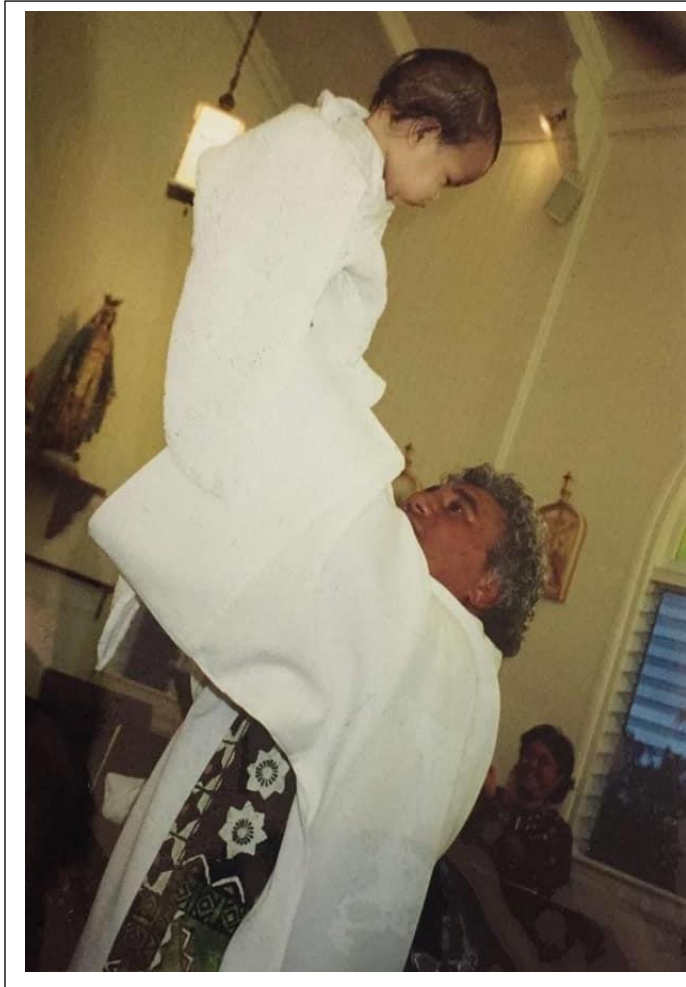

## Sunday Connection

Mark 13:24-32

Jesus teaches about the signs of the coming of the Son of Man.

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. He then offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times.

Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for us.

Many things in our lives and in our world are subject to change. Yet all of us find security in relationships and values that endure. Foremost among these are our family relationships. We can confidently accept change if we know that we will continue to be loved by our family and by God. We help impart this sense of trust and confidence in our children with our daily assurances to them that nothing can change our love for them.

### Monsignor Etuale Etuale

Father Etuale Etuale became our parish priest  
in July of 1998 when Fr, Alapaki was called to  
Oahu to serve at St Rita in Nanakuli.

Father Eutale was a doer, often times, he  
would get a project started and then announce  
to the parish what he did and is in the process  
of accomplishing.

Father comes from a farming background and  
saw the parish lands as an opportunity to farm,  
organize people to farm and proceeded to clean  
all of the of parish and diocese land. He was  
the pioneer for the Meditation Trail, planted all  
of the citrus trees, cut down the huge  
eucalyptus trees that fronted the rectory, made  
and fenced the lawn so the parish had  
somewhere to have outdoors activities. He  
convalidated 28 couples in 2002, complete  
with a luau that followed the ceremony. Fr  
Etuale put into motion and completed the  
church's restroom in 2001 all with parish  
volunteers help. He also is responsible for  
changing the church's roof. Father's homilies  
were always down to earth and applicable to  
life and our relationship God. He was a good  
listener, and loved to work outdoors. He was  
the main worker of the fields and it's  
maintenance. We were able to sell noni fruit  
that he planted for a number of years into the  
next priest stay. Noni would be harvested once  
a week by volunteers and taken to the noni  
factory. Fr. Etuale was always thinking of  
others. Never himself. He died of liver  
complications in Samoa. We love you Father.

**KEY QUESTION:**

**How can all the members of the Catholic Church be more effective in proclaim the living Jesus Christ to the world?**

**Diocesan Phase in the Diocese of Honolulu**  
**October 17, 2021-February 28, 2022**

There are ten Themes to be used as starting points and guidelines. Themes will continue for the next few weeks. We did 1 & 2 last week and this week Have discussions in groups, in your home, in your workplace, the objective is to be inclusive as possible. Summarize responses and email to <https://bit.ly/SynodResponses>. Combined reports will be collated and sent to the Vatican in preparation for the October 2023 Synod of Bishops where representative bishops from throughout the world will convene and meet with our Holy Father.

3. **SPEAKING OUT** *All are invited to speak with courage and parrhesia, that is freedom, And charity. What enables or hinders peaking up courageously, candidly, and responsibly in our local Church and in Society? When and how do we manage to say what is important to us? How does the relationship with the local media work (not Catholic media)? Who speaks in behalf on the Christian community and how are they chosen?*
4. **CELEBRATION** *“Walking together” is only possible if it is based on communal Listening to the Word and the celebration of the Eucharist. How do prayer and liturgical Celebrations actually inspire and guide our common life and mission in our community? How do they inspire the most important decisions? How do we promote the active participation of all the faithful in the liturgy? What space is given to participating in the ministry of lector and acolyte?*
