Reflection on Matthew 25:14-30

Transforming Gifts

This week we see it is not one's talents or gifts that matter, but what we do with them. A master prepares to leave for a long journey and entrusts three servants with various sums of money to invest for him. The first thing to notice is that all three servants are trusted to do what is right by their master. That they are each given various amounts of money shows that while the three servants are not equal in talent they are all expected to be equal in their efforts.

Everyone of us is given our own talents and gifts. Some people receive more than others but this does not make those with fewer gifts less important. It is often the small cog that moves the big wheel. It wasn't the apostles who had been faithfully following Jesus who fed the multitudes, it was a young boy who was willing to share whatever he had, a few fish and barley loaves, who made it possible for Jesus to perform a miracle.


The gifts and talents that God gives each of us are meant to be transforming gifts. They are not meant solely for ourselves but for the greater good of the Kingdom of God that we strive to continually make present in the world. At every Mass we hear the prayer: "Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread that we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life." This is followed by a similar prayer over the wine which becomes our spiritual drink. Wheat and grapes are gifts from God which grow through the earth and are harvested by human labor. Together they are offered back to God and are transformed into the very Body and Blood of Christ, the bread from heaven and the cup of salvation. God's gifts are always life-giving.

Today, think about what gifts and talents God has entrusted you with. No matter how big or small (think of the mustard seed) - do you nurture, develop, and use them to make your life and that of your family better? Do you also use them in the service of God and our community? Do you allow the power of the Holy Spirit to enter your life and transform those gifts into making Jesus present in the world today? God gave you your gifts because God trusts in you. Now trust in God that these gifts can be transformative in your life.



**BISHOP LARRY'S
DISPENSATION UPDATE**

“Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through December 31, 2020. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can. It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary
