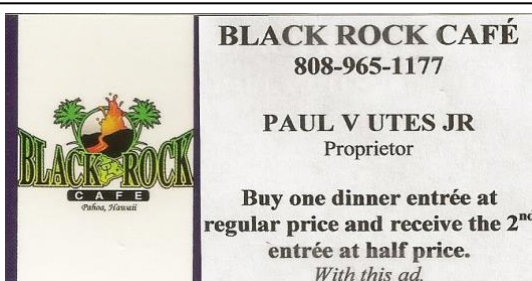

Cannot Marry in the Catholic Church Due to A Prior Marriage?

Pope Francis streamlined the process to petition for a declaration of nullity to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the mandatory fee. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior martial bond was invalid for some reason, that he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage. Sunday Connection

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. (The second will be read at Mass next Sunday.) This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer.

(Next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.) While the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point. God is not like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers. God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.

Children nag because it works. Parents, like the judge in the parable, often get worn down by the persistence of their children asking for things large and small. Nagging is not a positive trait, to be sure. The confidence and the persistence behind this behavior, however, confidence in the goodness of the giver and the tenacity to stay in the relationship, are traits worth emulating in our relationship with God.

Read together Luke 18:1-8. Talk about appropriate ways to make needs and desires known to one another and to God in prayer. Recall that God wants to answer our prayers. As a family, offer your needs as prayers of petition to God.

Marriage Preparation Requirements

1st meeting: The couple needs to meet and do an interview. Couple will meet together and separately with pastor or designated person.

You will be provided with Engagement Encounter registration information. Couples must procure from their church of baptism a new baptismal certificate with notations.

Circumstances regarding couples' status for marriage will be discussed and proper steps initiated hence forth.

IMPORTANT: The date for the wedding is to be set after the Engagement Encounter class requirement is fulfilled.

2nd meeting: You get acquainted with the presider who will officiate. Completion of the following to take place: Premarital Inventory, discussions on marriage, quality of the relationship, spiritual and religious practices, and family.

Meetings to follow will depend on how much more discussion is needed for the couple and being sure all forms have been complete.

Engagement Encounter Certificate is a requirement and must be presented after completing the class.

Marriage license acquired before the wedding date.

FAITH FORMATION

The new order of Faith Formation, previously Religious Education, now have updated the requirements for receiving 1st Holy Communion, Confirmation and RCIA.

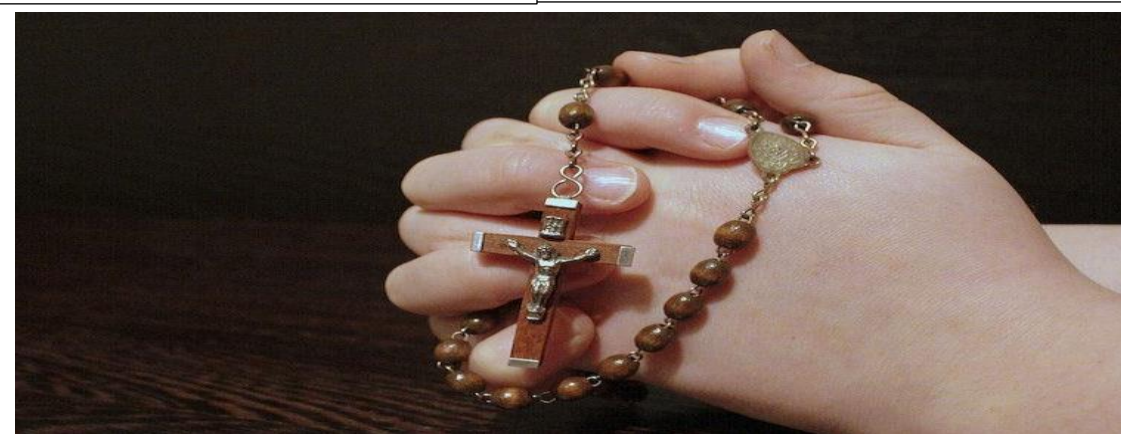

The Our Lady of Sorrows of Pahoa (on the cover)

The Our Lady of Sorrows statue was commissioned from China by Jonathan Perreira, son of Isabelle and John Perreira. It was originally ordered to have the resemblance of St Marianne Cope, which obviously the statue does not have. It was then by public acclamation that the statue became that of Our Lady of Sorrows.

The statue was originally destined to be displayed either at St Joseph Church or at St Joseph School in Hilo. It appears that the leaders of the two said destinations did not deem their places suitable for the devotion to the Lady of Sorrows. The 8-foot-tall solid white marble statue remained packed at St Joseph School storage shed since 2012.

Only then, the Perreira Family thought of offering the statue to the Sacred Heart Church Pahoa graveyard “to honor” the outstanding parish services of Isabelle Andrade Perreira and Remigio Salazar.

The definite transfer of the statue to Pahoa church graveyard did not materialize for 10 years and for many reasons. The renewed insistent desire of transporting the statue to Pahoa church complex was solicited by Mike Tavares, grandson of the Perreira couple, through the long-time Sacred Heart parishioner, George Salazar.

In 2018, the St Joseph School principal, Dr Llewellyn Young indicated to the then newly assigned Administrator of Pahoa Parish that the statue had to be finally transported to the church complex. The effects of the pandemics prolonged the processes of the actual transfer. Meanwhile, for unknown reasons, the statue was now to be found at St. Theresa’s Church – Mountain View and there it could still be seen in its original wooden casing.

At the beginning of this year 2022, there have been prolonged phone calls and continuous insistence of the grandson of the Perreira couple with Sharen Chaves who was requested by the Parish Administrator to deal with the transfer of the statue. Finally, the pastor of St Theresa’s – Mountain View gave a strong suggestion that in September 2022 the transporting of the statue had to be accomplished.

With the coordination programmed by Mr. Jim Manion, the present chairperson of the Sacred Heart – Pahoa Parish Building, Planning and Maintenance, and the generosity of Roberta and Allen Mendes of St Theresa’s Church – Mountain View, the statue was brought from St Theresa’s Church to the graveyard of Sacred Heart Church on Wednesday, October 5, 2022 at 11:11 in the morning. With the help of four volunteers at Sacred Heart Church, the temporary platform upon which the statue stands secure was done. A more stable base is planned to be constructed in a later time.

The statue of Our Lady of Sorrows can now be seen and admired at her post near the 11th and 12th Stations of the Parish “Way of the Cross” Meditation Trail, “in her absolutely stunning posture of humility and supplication,” praying for us and with us.

The once “homeless” statue has at last found shelter on the grounds of Sacred Heart Church – Pahoa and hopefully, in the hearts of all.
