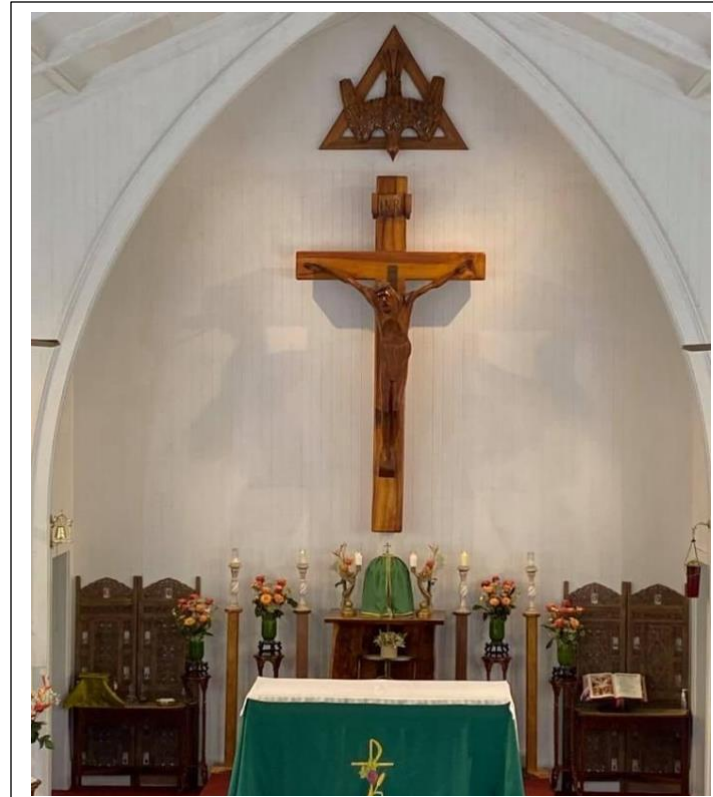

## Sunday Connection

Mark 10:2-16 (shorter form Mark 10:2-12)

Jesus teaches against divorce and welcomes the children.

In Jesus's time divorce under certain conditions was acceptable under the Law of Moses. God made this law with Moses because of the stubbornness of the Jewish people. Quoting the book Genesis counters God's original intention that men and women would be become one flesh in marriage. Jesus' teaching about divorce and remarriage can be a challenging one for many people. The Church continues to uphold the strong and positive teaching of Jesus that God intends for a man and woman to make a lifelong commitment to one another in the Sacrament of Marriage. Many of us, however, know people whose marriage has not been a lifelong commitment. The example of Jesus teaches us that we are called to act with compassion and love in our relationships with all, and especially when people are hurting. Among the purposes of marriage is raising children. By welcoming children and fostering their relationship with God, parents and families bear witness to the Kingdom of God. Most importantly, we remember that when marriages thrive, it is a sign of God's grace at work.

**FOOD PANTRY MINISTRY**

Sacred Heart Pahoia sponsors two food pantries. On the Star of the Sea grounds on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month our volunteers do a distribution in the early afternoon. At Sacred Heart Avery Hall a food pantry distribution is held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month. Hawaii Food Basket is the primary source of supplies but we also receive food and brown paper bags from our parishioners. All of your donations are appreciated and everyone is thankful. Both pantries are open to the public servicing our Puna district. In September, the Kalapana Food Pantry served 72 families, consisting of 17 children, 58 adults and 38 seniors. At the Sacred Heart site we served 117 families, 63 being children, 102 adult and 101 seniors. The next Food Pantry distribution will be on October 21, 2021. If you have donations of fresh produce to share, we will be able to receive your donations on Wednesday October 20<sup>th</sup> all day, or in the morning of October 21.
