


LIVING THE WORD * A Reflection on Matthew 18:21-35 COUNTING ON FORGIVENESS

Leave it up to Peter to jump into the fray and ask Jesus how often he should forgive his brother. He doesn't even pause before answering his own question "up to seven times." Peter thought he was being magnanimous, for didn't the rabbis teach, you only had to forgive your brother three times. Peter was willing to go beyond doubling what the rabbis taught. If he was expecting to be commended by Jesus he must have been very disappointed to hear Jesus say he should forgive his brother seventy times seven times. Or in other words, there is to be no limit to forgiveness. Forgiveness and mercy are the cornerstone of the new covenant. "I shall make a new covenant with the house of Israel...I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts, and they will be my people...for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sins no more."

(cf Jeremiah 31:31-34)

If it is to mean and actually do anything, forgiveness has to be linked with reconciliation. Jesus died for our sins offering us forgiveness, but that was not the end goal. The Eucharistic Prayer says, it was through Jesus' death that God "willed to reconcile us to [himself]." It goes on to say "May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world. Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth... Forgiveness is completely intertwined and inseparable from reconciliation, peace, salvation, faith, charity.

Forgiveness and mercy are the heart of Christianity, they should be the air in our lungs, the blood in our heart. How can we faithfully say the Lord's Prayer "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" if we are not willing to forgive others as often as God is willing to forgive us, repeatedly, day after day, month after month, year after year? Take a moment of silence, try counting the number of times God has forgiven you, then ask for the grace to always be forgiving of others. + *September 13, 2020 * 24thSunday in Ordinary Time +
