
# What's been going on:

It's already that time of year to get the farm ready for chickens! We got quite a bit done with the fence line last year, but we didn't get it completed before the winter weather made the ground too hard to work in. The winter was fairly mild, but when the cold weather hit...it HIT!! We had several days of deep snow as well as negative temperatures. The egg-layers stayed indoors during those days, and they needed a little heat to keep the eggs from freezing in the nestboxes. They were troopers, though, and the kept us and our customers in eggs all winter. We are still getting some snow flurries and days/nights in the teens, but they are the exception now. The days are mostly in the 40s-50s with the nights in the upper 20s-30s. That means it's time to get chicks on order and get the tractors repaired. We get our chicks through Duncan Poultry up in Missouri Valley, and we have our first official pickup date of April 10th. That means we will have chickens processed and available beginning of June! We will update the website with dates for preorder once we pick up the first batch. We will also begin work on the fence again around that time. The ground should be thawed enough to get some more of the posts in and start trenching for the water lines. If you're not sure why we are doing the fence and water, our plan is to bring meat goats to the farm as soon as the infrastructure is in place. Speaking of infrastructure, you may have seen a social media post or two about our current project (one of them). We are putting in a shop/barn that will function as a worksop, farm store, and corral for the animals. Our little farm has gotten too big for the basement, so we will be moving the equipment and supplies to the shop. It's a huge endeavor as we've gone with a Quonset hut that will take some serious elbow grease to get erected. We've already got the dirt work done, and the concrete will be poured in a few weeks. There is already so much going on, and we haven't even started putting birds on pasture yet! We will keep you up-to-date with the happenings, and as always we are so grateful for you joining us on this adventure!
