## What's been going on:

Wow...are we already halfway through the summer?! It feels like we were just shoveling snow a few days ago, but sure enough the end of summer is on the horizon. We did get a visit from our son for his birthday and Father's Day, so we got to get the whole family out and enjoy quality time together. It was awesome to put some of the projects on hold for a bit and get in some extra laughs and new memories. Speaking of projects, the concrete for the shop is down, and we are just waiting for it to be cut to the final dimensions before we start building sections. We also lost a couple of birds to the high winds when one of our tractors was blown across the pasture during 100mph+ gusts. Thank goodness our little peeps were small, because that probably saved them from being wrapped up in the structure when it took flight. Unfortunately, we did lose a couple, and the tractor was completely destroyed. Each incident is an opportunity to improve our process, so we are using this as a chance to improve their structures. The second batch has been processed, and that batch sold out as well. Batch 3 will be here soon, and nearly half of them are already pre-sold. We are currently planning on only one more batch this year as well as turkeys for Thanksgiving. We've taken on a smaller number of meat birds again this year to ensure we can focus on our growing list of projects. Hopefully we get a big chunk of those projects taken care of so we can go back to growing our farm. Thank you so much for being part of this exciting time...we couldn't do it without you!

If you've ever seen a hive with the bees hanging in clumps on the outside of the hive front, that's bearding. They do it when the inside temperature of the hive is very high. It allows only essential workers and the queen to remain inside with greater airflow to lower the ambient temperature. They're such smart little critters!
