



STAR BORDER FOR BLOCKS

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Mist (Background)

- (1) 13 ½" square A
- (4) 6 ½" squares B

Ocean T5

• (4) 7 1/4" squares – C

SEWING DIRECTIONS - NO WASTE FLYING GEESE METHOD (4 AT A TIME)

- 1. Mark diagonal lines on the back of (4) C squares.
- 2. With right sides together (RST), place (2) C squares on opposite corners of A, overlapping in the middle so the diagonal lines align. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. (Fig. 1)
- 3. Cut apart on the line. Open up the triangles and press seams toward the C fabric (or press open). (Fig. 2)
- 4. Place the remaining (2) C squares RST on the unused corners, with the diagonal line going from corner to center. Stitch ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line. (Fig. 3)
- 5. Cut apart on the line. Open up triangles and press seam toward the C fabric (or press open). Trim each to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".









- 6. Arrange the flying geese units and B squares around the 12 ½" center block according to the block diagram. Sew the top row, middle row, and bottom row. Press seams open, or toward the B squares for the top and bottom row, and toward the center block for the middle row.
- 7. Sew the rows together, pressing seams open. Finished block size should measure 24 ½" square.
