Dear Parents / Guardians,

Free School Lunches - Because of the circumstances of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the US Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Services have notified the Ohio Department of Education that they have extended free lunches for all students for the rest of the 2021-2022 School Year. Because St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic School participates in the National School Lunch Program, we have applied and been approved to exercise the waiver for the rest of the School Year.

Unfortunately, this is only for meal purchases. If your student(s) packs and needs milk, they will still be a charge of \$0.50 per milk. Milk tickets are available for purchase, if you are interested or milk can be bought daily.
