# Updated Regarding 2021-2022 School Year and COVID-19 Policies

We promised to continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation as we begin this school year. Our goal has been and continues to be keeping our students in school for in-person learning; we believe that this best supports the formation and education of our young people. We must also acknowledge the fact that this virus continues to present challenges to our community, is unpredictable, and, at times, is very destructive. Therefore, we are providing additional policies at this time:

• Masks are strongly recommended and may be mandated when local circumstances are considered. We continue to join the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Ohio Department ofHealth (ODH) and strongly recommend that students, faculty, and staff *who are not fully vaccinated* wear a mask. We support your right to choose if your child should wear a mask or not and at this time it is still a RECOMMENDATION - NOT a REQUIREMENT. We ask that if you choose to have your student wear a mask that you attach them to a lanyard. This helps keep their masks clean by keeping them from falling on the floor or ground.

**Please keep in mind that m**asks may be required for a period of time in the event of a COVID-19 outbreak in a school or community, or for any reason in which a local health department deems it to be necessary due to local circumstances.

•  $\Omega \varepsilon \ \omega \lambda \lambda$  provide for social distancing of at least 3 feet between desks, as possible. Earlier this month, the ODH had issued new guidelines for students and adults who are exposed to COVID-19 in a classroom setting. As part of this guidance, when all three prevention measures are in place including the use of a mask, physical distancing of at least 3 feet between desks, and other prevention policies (i.e. protocols for cleaning, identification of those experiencing symptoms, etc.)students and adults may not need to quarantine. In many cases, social distancing continues to be a safe,effective, and unobtrusive prevention measure.

• **Proper quarantine procedures have been updated and must be followed.** As part of the previously mentioned ODH guidelines, students and adults who are unvaccinated and unmasked are required to quarantine for a minimum of 7 days with a negative COVID-19 test or quarantine for 10 days without a test, following exposure to a COVID-19 positive individual at school.**Those who are masked, regardless of vaccination status, will be permitted to remain in school.**

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# **ProgressBook**

Your ProgressBook account should be up and ready for you. If you established an account last year, you can still access ProgressBook with the same log in and password. If you have forgotten either of these, please let us know and we will assist you.

If you did not establish an account last year or you are a new family to the school, a letter will be coming home soon explaining how to setup your account with a key code for you to set up a new username and password. If you have any trouble accessing ProgressBook, let the school office know. We will work to get the issue resolved for you. This is a tremendous tool for you to keep track of your child(ren's) grades and homework.

# Football Crazr2021 Fundraiser

This year, we have decided to partner with Van Wert Council of the Knights of Columbus to help us meet our fundraising goals. The Knights of Columbus have been doing the same type of fundraiser for many years and it makes sense to work together. The Knights have agreed to donate \$14 of every ticket sold back to the School. In return, the Knights receive a discount on their total taxes they must pay as part of their membership into the Knights of Columbus. We feel that this will be a win for both groups.

A Football Ticket Sweepstakes is a unique, sweepstakes fundraiser based on professional football, where game card holders root for four pro football teams randomly assigned each week to their game card and each week those teams can change. No two game cards are alike and \$2,500 in cash prizes are given out each week based on the number of points scored and yards gained by the football teams printed on their game cards. The Knights have also agreed to **guarantee at least \$100 will be paid out locally each week!** 

**The cost of a card is \$20**. With that \$20 donation, you are entered into a chance to win cash for 10 weeks starting November 7<sup>th</sup> and ending January 9<sup>th</sup>. Each family has received 10 game cards to sell. Simply have the person fill out the stub portion of the card and return it to the office with payment. **On the stub it will ask for a Council #, please write 6034 on each sold stub** as that is how the Knights will get their credit for the sale as well. Once returned, the Knights will take care of making sure that winners get paid each week.

Students are responsible to return all sold and unsold game cards. We must have all game cards returned to office by **Wednesday, September 15, 2021.** We must turn in all sold cards to be activated for them to be eligible to win. If you would like more game cards, please contact the school office and additional cards will be sent more home with your child. Our goal is to sell 700 game cards, which would profit the school \$9,800. With your help, we feel we can score a touchdown with this fundraising event! All funds generated by this fundraiser go directly to helping pay for the operations of the school.
