The Rosenwald Centennial Project:

My name is Kijana (www.kijana.com) I am a master-degreed creative director and performing Griot "Edu-tainer." I am also the proud eldest daughter and only living child of Huntsville's award-winning educator for 54 years, the late **Mary Helen Wilson Wiseman, M.Ed.** (www.maryhwiseman.com).

I have inherited and cleared the land that held Huntsville's 1st Black public grade school—the Rosenwald School #1— active from 1921 through roughly 1960. **Julius Rosenwald** (early 20th Century president of Sears and Roebuck) donated \$63 million of his personal wealth to help Booker T. Washington create over 5,300 schools in 15 states across the south. **Professors Samuel W. Houston, John Wesley Wilson** and John's wife **Amarintha Kittrell Wilson** took advantage of the "Rosenwald Fund" and founded two schools that improved the futures of thousands of young lives. Rosenwald School#1 was a small, 2 room school complex with a well, Kitchen and separate outhouses for boys and girls. It served as a community center for meetings, events, picnics, etc "Rosenwald School Road" was the place to go for horse & foot races, basketball, contests and other sporting events. (The name was later later shortened & misspelled as "Rosenwall Road.")

My mother loved Rosenwald. She was born around the corner and felt the Rosenwald School was a gift to her from God. As a toddler, they say Mary Helen would sneak into the school classrooms—impatient to be old enough to learn. Years later, Rosenwald was where Mother returned after college for her first teaching assignment—before marrying my father, moving to Houston and becoming a 5x "Teacher of the Year" educator. 1962: The school is demolished and the 2 acres were sold by the ISD to

David Branch Jr. Mother and told her father she wanted it. **Charlie Wilson** bought the land back from Mr. Branch and willed it to her. **2022: Our family is preparing the land for a "off the grid" future** with atmospheric water generation and two 400 sq.ft. tiny home, solar-powered Boxabl Casitas (<u>boxabl.com</u>)— to symbolize the 2-room Rosenwald schoolhouse that once stood on the land.

The Kittrell-Wilson Cemetery a 130 year old family cemetery is located near the Thompson's creek behind the school grounds. This is where the founders and custodians of the original Rosenwald school are buried. We are therefore raising fund for the Samuel Walker Museum and Kittrell-Wilson Cemetery Restoration fund.

The Rosenwald Centennial Project

" An Oasis of Education, 1921"

One hundred years ago, a public school education was a dream for most Black children.

From 1912-1932, Julius Rosenwald decided to donate \$63 million of his personal fortune to make a difference in the lives of over 600,000 youngsters in 15 states. The "Return to Our Roots" Earth Day festival is a centennial celebration of Huntsville's 100 year old Rosenwald School grounds, the legacy of the Man, the Fund, Founders, and Alumni that nurtured, educated and galvanized a small rural community in the early 1900's.

WHAT ARE ROSENWALD SCHOOLS?

Julius Rosenwald (1862-1932) was a Chicago businessman, philanthropist and partowner of Sears, Roebuck and Company whose Jewish family fled persecution in Europe. Rosenwald believed all Americans deserve an education. 1912: He established the Rosenwald Fund for "the well-being of mankind" and collaborated with educator/former slave, Booker T. Washington and his Tuskegee Institute to build over 5,300 rural school buildings for colored children across the Jim Crow south. English Instructor **John Wesley Wilson** (8/12/1860 - 4/20/1948) and his wife, **Amarintha Kittrell Wilson** (8/9/1864 - 4/4/1944) were concerned about providing a formal education for their little brown grandchildren. In **1921**, **a**s per Rosenwald guidelines, the couple transferred 2 acres of land to the Huntsville Independent School District and, with the help of the fund, John's cousin **Samuel W. Houston** and the community, raised the funds needed for the creation of Rosenwald's original two-room schoolhouse. The founders and many of the caregivers are interred in the Kittrell-Wilson Cemetery behind the school grounds. Professor Samuel Walker Houston (1864-1945) was John Wesley Wilson's cousin and the son of Joshua Houston, Texas'1st black County Commissioner. This prolific Huntsville educator built several Huntsville Texas educational institutions with the help of substantial funding from The Rosenwald Fund. A local, underserved Samuel Walker Houston Museum and Cultural Center is currently housed in the same building where the former Samuel W. 
