The Rosenwald School Project

" An Oasis of Education, 1921"

One hundred years ago, a public school education was a dream for most Black children.

From 1912-1932, Julius Rosenwald decided to donate \$63 million of his personal fortune to make a difference in the lives of over 600,000 youngsters in 15 states. The **"Back to Our Roots" Earth Day festival** is a centennial celebration of Huntsville's 100+ year old Rosenwald School grounds, the legacy of the Man, the Fund, Founders, and Alumni that nurtured, educated and galvanized a small rural community in the early 1900's.

WHAT ARE ROSENWALD SCHOOLS?

Julius Rosenwald (1862-1932) was a Chicago businessman, philanthropist and part-owner of Sears, Roebuck and Company whose Jewish family fled persecution in Europe. Rosenwald believed all Americans deserve an education. **1912:** He established the Rosenwald Fund for "the well-being of mankind" and collaborated with educator/former slave, Booker T. Washington and his Tuskegee Institute to build over 5,300 rural school buildings for colored children across the Jim Crow south. English Instructor John Wesley Wilson (8/12/1860 - 4/20/1948) and his wife, Amarintha Kittrell Wilson (8/9/1864 - 4/4/1944) were concerned about providing a formal education for their little brown grandchildren. In **1921**, **a**s per Rosenwald guidelines, the couple transferred 2 acres of land to the Huntsville Independent School District and, with the help of the fund, John's cousin **Samuel W. Houston** and the community, raised the funds needed for the creation of Rosenwald's original two-room schoolhouse. The founders and many of the caregivers are interred in the Kittrell-Wilson Cemetery behind the school grounds. Professor Samuel Walker Houston (1864-1945) was John Wesley Wilson's cousin and the son of Joshua Houston, Texas'1st black County Commissioner. This prolific Huntsville educator built several Huntsville Texas educational institutions with the help of substantial funding from The Rosenwald Fund. A local, underserved Samuel Walker Houston Museum and Cultural Center is currently housed in the same building where the former Samuel W. 

guidelines, the couple transferred 2 acres of land to the HuntsvilleISD and, with family and community, raised the funds needed for the creation of the original 2room school building with a kitchen, well and 2 outhouses. John and Amarintha's children, cousins and grandchildren attended & helped maintain It.*

1921-1962: With dedicated educators such as Esther Bridges, Maddy Jewel Walker, Thelma McGuire, Mary Helen Wilson (alumni & granddaughter of John & Amarintha), plus volunteers from the Kittrell, Wilson, Spivey, Cotton, Wiley, Vann, Baker, Crawford, Houston families et.al, Rosenwald School grew until "Rosenwald School Road" was





1962: Rosenwald School#1 is demolished and the land auctioned to David Branch Jr. who, in 1963, sold it back to Charlie Wilson (John & Amarintha's eldest son). 1966: Mary Helen Wilson Wiseman, **M.Ed.** requested that her father Charlie will the beloved school grounds to her.

2020: Rosenwald Acres was inherited by Mary Helen's eldest, Kijana Wiseman-Fusilier, M.Ed. (WisemanCompany.com, kijana.com); with **Joy D**. Wiseman and LaTanya Michell Brooks, M.Ed. (GrowWithStem.com, nextlevelpublishing.com). 2022: The land is being planned for habitation as a renewable energy, environmentally-friendly, homestead using 2 solar-powered Boxabl Casitas where the school stood.
