

Paycheck Vocab 101

Every working American gets a paycheck, but do you know and understand everything that goes into (or comes out of) what you are able to put in the bank?

Gross Pay: This is the total amount you earn based on your annual salary or hourly wage. Taxes and voluntarily withheld items are not deducted.

Deductions: Any amount that is taken out of your paycheck. Examples include taxes, employee benefits, and retirement plan contributions.

Federal Income Tax: This amount is determined by your W-4, and is required by your employer to withhold from your wages to pay federal taxes. If you do not fill out a Form W-4, you will be taxed at the highest rate, which is "Single/Zero".

State Income Tax: This is a percentage deducted from an individual's gross pay to contribute to state income taxes. Only Alaska, Florida, Nevada, South Dakota, Texas, Washington, Wyoming, New Hampshire, Tennessee do not have state income taxes.

Local Tax: Local tax varies depending on your state and local jurisdiction. Several states have very complicated local tax structures, including Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Ohio. Most states do not impose a local tax.

FICA: The Federal Insurance Contribution Act is comprised of two parts: Medicare and Social Security. This is paid equally by the employer and employee.

Social Security: Social Security taxes are used by the federal government to pay Social Security benefits. Social Security is a system designed to help support retired individuals, widows and widowers, and people who are disabled. Social Security is officially called Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance (OASDI). Currently 6.2% for employee and 6.2% for the employer.

Medicare: Medicare tax is used to fund the government's Medicare program, which provides subsidized healthcare and hospital insurance benefits to retirees and the disabled. Currently 1.45% for the employee, and 1.45% for the employer.

Voluntary Contributions: Your voluntary contributions consist of items you voluntarily sign up for, like health insurance, dental and vision insurance, and retirement plans.

Involuntary Items: Involuntary items are also withheld from your paycheck. These can include child support, defaulted student loans, taxes, and unpaid court fines.

Wage Garnishment: when a court issues an order requiring your employer to withhold a certain amount of your paycheck and send it directly to the person or institution to whom you owe money, until your debt is paid off.

Net Pay: This is what you get to take home, after all deductions.
